- I. Ordinance No. 2016-05, rezoning property located southeast of and adjacent to Robert J. Conlan Boulevard, and west of and adjacent to the Florida East Coast Railway, from LI (Light Industrial and Warehousing District) and HI (Heavy Industrial District) to BMU (Bayfront Mixed Use District) (24.10 acres)(Case No. CPZ-12-2015, Citizens Bank & Trust), for final reading.

Ordinance No. 2016-43, amending the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map to change the designated use of property located south and adjacent to Chaska Street, in the vicinity south of Americana Boulevard, from Recreation and Open Space Use to Single Family Residential Use (3.48 acres)(Case No. CP-11-2016, City of Palm Bay), only one reading required.
- Ordinance No. 2016-44, amending the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map to change the designated use of property located north of and adjacent to Hathaway Road, in the vicinity north of Hartsdale Avenue, from Recreation and Open Space Use to Single Family Residential Use (2.59 acres)(Case No. CP-12-2016, City of Palm Bay), only one reading required.
- Ordinance No. 2016-45, amending the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map to change the designated use of property located north of and adjacent to Whealan Street, in the vicinity north of Jupiter Boulevard, from Recreation and Open Space Use to Single Family Residential Use (2.8 acres)(Case No. CP-13-2016, City of Palm Bay), only one reading required.
- 7. Ordinance No. 2016-46, amending the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map to change the designated use of property located south and adjacent to Zanzibar Road, in the vicinity south of Waco Boulevard and west of San Filippo Drive, from Recreation and Open Space Use to Single Family Residential Use (2.23 acres)(Case No. CP-14-2016, City of Palm Bay), only one reading required.
- *8. Request by Bayridge West, LLC for a final subdivision to be known as Bayridge Subdivision in SRE (Suburban Residential Estate District) zoning (39.75 acres)(Case No. FS-1-2016).

Councilmembers who are members of the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) may discuss TPO issues which may subsequently be addressed by the TPO.

If an individual decides to appeal any decision made by the City Council with respect to any matter considered at this meeting, a record of the proceedings will be required and the individual will need to ensure that a verbatim transcript of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is based (FS 286.0105). Such person must provide a method for recording the proceedings verbatim.

Any aggrieved or adversely affected person desiring to become a party in the quasi-judicial proceeding shall provide written notice to the City Clerk which notice shall, at a minimum, set forth the aggrieved or affected person's name, address, and telephone number, indicate how the aggrieved or affected person qualifies as an aggrieved or affected person and indicate whether the aggrieved or affected person is in favor of or opposed to the requested quasi-judicial action. The required notice must be received by the Clerk no later than five (5) business days at the close of business, which is 5 p.m., before the hearing. (§ 59.03, Palm Bay Code of Ordinances).
