The required notice must be received by the Clerk no later than five (5) business days at the close of business, which is 5 p.m., before the hearing. (Section 59.03, Palm Bay Code of Ordinances).

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TITLE V, LEGISLATIVE, CHAPTER 50, ELECTIONS, SUBCHAPTER 'FILLING OF VACANCIES', BY MODIFYING PROVISIONS CONTAINED THEREIN PURSUANT TO THE PALM BAY CITY CHARTER; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CITY OF PALM BAY CODE OF ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY,

BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City of Palm Bay Code of Ordinances, Title V, Legislative,

Chapter 50, Elections, Subchapter 'Filling of Vacancies', is hereby amended and shall

henceforth read as follows:

"Section 50.50 MAYOR — PERMANENT VACANCY.

(A) When a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of mayor as a result of death, resignation, illness, disability, forfeiture of office, written court order, or other lawful written order or action, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) When there is one (1) year or less remaining in the term of said office, the deputy mayor shall assume the responsibilities of that office until the remainder of the term, or >>By appointment of the majority of the remaining members within sixty (60) days. If the majority of the remaining members of the City Council fail to fill the vacancy through appointment within the sixty-day period, a special election to fill the vacancy shall be called and held in a manner coordinated by the City Clerk with the Supervisor of Elections and adopted by resolution of the City Council. All vacancy elections will run concurrent with the regularly scheduled city elections. Appointments will be to serve until the next general election cycle.<<

When more than one (1) year is left remaining in the term of said (2) office and no general municipal election is scheduled within one (1) year, a special election shall be scheduled to be held no sooner than ninety (90) days or more than one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the vacancy. The deputy mayor shall act as the mayor until a new mayor is elected. The individual elected shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term. The acting mayor will then resume the position of deputy mayor for the remaining balance of his/her appointment and remain on the city council to complete his/her elected term. >>The vacancy shall be announced at not less than two (2) public meetings of council. A solicitation period of thirty (30) days, or as close thereto, shall be given for the receipt of applications. When the number of applications received exceeds the number of vacant positions, each councilmember shall rank the individuals from 1 - , with Number 1 representing the councilmember's first choice. Council may decide prior to the initial ranking, to have additional rounds of voting at a subsequent meeting. If there are five (5) or more applicants, only the five (5) applicants receiving the lowest ranking shall advance to a subsequent round of voting. Council shall then rank the applicants and the applicant receiving the lowest total shall fill the vacancy. In the event of a tie, the applicant with the highest number shall be eliminated and Council shall then rank the remaining applicants. Appointments shall be made at a public council meeting following the two announcements, or if no applications are received within the time frame designated, at a special council meeting called for that purpose.<<

Section 50.51 MAYOR — TEMPORARY VACANCY — COURT ORDER, OTHER LAWFUL ORDER OR ACTION.

(A) When a temporary vacancy occurs in the office of mayor as a result of a written suspension by court order or other written lawful order or action, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) The deputy mayor shall assume the responsibilities of the office until the suspension by court order or other lawful order or action becomes final, the mayor is returned to office, or the term of office expires, whichever occurs first.

(2) If the mayor is not reinstated, the position shall be filled in accordance with 50.50(A)(1) or (2), whichever is applicable.

Section 50.52 MAYOR — TEMPORARY VACANCY — ILLNESS OR DISABILITY.

(A) When a temporary vacancy occurs in the office of mayor as a result of an illness or mental or physical disability, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) The mayor is required to notify the city council of such illness or disability pursuant to section 3.063 of the city charter. The determination of such illness or disability shall be made by an affirmative vote of at least three (3) councilmembers.

(2) After the determination of such illness or disability by the city council, should the mayor be absent from twelve (12) consecutive regular council meetings, the office shall be deemed vacated.

(3) The deputy mayor shall assume the responsibilities of the office until the mayor is able to return to office, the term of office expires, or the office is filled in accordance with § 50.50(A)(1) or (2), whichever occurs first.

Section 50.53 DEPUTY MAYOR.

During any period the deputy mayor assumes the position of mayor, due to either a permanent or temporary vacancy, the city council shall select one of its members to serve as acting deputy mayor for the balance of the appointment of deputy mayor or until such time as the office of mayor is filled as provided in § 50.50(A)(1) or (2), whichever is applicable.

Section 50.54 COUNCIL SEAT.

The vacant council seat, created by the council action taken in § 50.53 above, shall be filled on an interim basis by a majority vote of the council. The individual chosen shall fill the position of councilmember and shall forfeit the seat of councilmember when the elected mayor resumes office or the newly elected mayor assumes the duties of the office of mayor.

Section 50.55 COUNCILMEMBER — PERMANENT VACANCY.

(A) When a permanent vacancy occurs in the office of councilmember as a result of death, resignation, illness, disability, forfeiture of office, written court order, or other lawful written order or action, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) When there is one (1) year or less remaining in the term of said office, the council shall, by a majority vote, choose a qualified successor to serve the remainder of the term. >>By appointment of the majority of the remaining members within sixty (60) days. If the majority of the remaining members of the City Council fail to fill the vacancy through appointment within the sixty-day period,

a special election to fill the vacancy shall be called and held in a manner coordinated by the City Clerk with the Supervisor of Elections and adopted by resolution of the City Council. All vacancy elections will run concurrent with the regularly scheduled city elections. Appointments will be to serve until the next general election cycle.<<

(2) When more than one (1) year is left remaining in the term of said office and no general municipal election is scheduled within one (1) year, a special election shall be scheduled to be held no sooner than ninety (90) days or more than one hundred eighty (180) days following the date of the vacancy. The individual elected shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term. >>The vacancy shall be announced at not less than two (2) public meetings of council. A solicitation period of thirty (30) days, or as close thereto, shall be given for the receipt of applications. When the number of applications received exceeds the number of vacant positions, each councilmember shall rank the individuals from 1 , with Number 1 representing the councilmember's first choice. Council may decide prior to the initial ranking, to have additional rounds of voting at a subsequent meeting. If there are five (5) or more applicants, only the five (5) applicants receiving the lowest ranking shall advance to a subsequent round of voting. Council shall then rank the applicants and the applicant receiving the lowest total shall fill the vacancy. In the event of a tie, the applicant with the highest number shall be eliminated and Council shall then rank the remaining applicants. Appointments shall be made at a public council meeting following the two announcements, or if no applications are received within the time frame designated, at a special council meeting called for that purpose.<<

Section 50.56 COUNCILMEMBER — TEMPORARY VACANCY — SUSPENSION BY COURT ORDER, OTHER LAWFUL ORDER OR ACTION.

(A) When a temporary vacancy occurs in the office of councilmember as a result of a written suspension by court order or other lawful written order or action, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) The council shall, by a majority vote, choose a qualified successor to assume the responsibilities of the office until the suspension by court order or other lawful order or action becomes final, the councilmember is returned to office, or the term of office expires, whichever occurs first.

(2) If the councilmember is not reinstated, the position shall be filled in accordance with § 50.55(A)(1) or (2), whichever is applicable.

Section 50.57 COUNCILMEMBER— TEMPORARY VACANCY — ILLNESS OR DISABILITY.

(A) When a temporary vacancy occurs in the office of councilmember as a result of an illness or mental or physical disability, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) The councilmember is required to notify the city council of such illness or disability pursuant to section 3.063 of the city charter. The determination of such illness or disability shall be made by an affirmative vote of at least three (3) councilmembers.

(2) After the determination of such illness or disability by the city council, should the councilmember be absent from twelve (12) consecutive regular council meetings, the office shall be deemed vacated.

(3) The council shall, by a majority vote, choose a qualified successor to assume the responsibilities of the office until the councilmember returns to office, the term of office expires, or the office is filled in accordance with § 50.55(A)(1) or (2), whichever occurs first.

Section 50.58 DISABILITY DEFINED.

For purposes of this subchapter, a disability is defined as a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits the ability of the mayor or councilmember to perform the essential duties of their elected positions. A permanent disability means there is no expectation of recovery; a temporary disability means that after a period of time there is an expectation of recovery.

Section 50.59 QUALIFIED SUCCESSOR.

Individuals appointed by the city council to fill temporary vacancies shall meet the city's qualifications for candidates seeking public office."

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby

repealed and all ordinances or parts of ordinances not in conflict herewith are hereby

continued in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. It is the intention of the City Council of the City of Palm Bay that the

provisions of this Ordinance shall be made a part of the City of Palm Bay Code of

Ordinances and the sections may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

SECTION 4. If any portion, clause, phrase, sentence or classification of this ordinance is held or declared to be either unconstitutional, invalid, inapplicable, inoperative or void, then such declaration shall not be construed to affect other portions of the ordinance; it is hereby declared to be the express opinion of the City Council of the City of Palm Bay that any such unconstitutional, invalid, inapplicable, inoperative or void portion or portions of this ordinance did not induce its passage, and that without the inclusion of any such portion or portions of this ordinance, the City Council would have enacted the valid constitutional portions thereof.

SECTION 5. The provisions within this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the enactment date.

REQUEST TO VACATE EASEMENT

PROPOSAL: Vacation of Easement is requested to vacate the Northerly 10 feet of the Southerly 20-foot Public Utility & Drainage Easement, less the Easterly 20 foot Public Utility & Drainage Easement, thereof containing 1052 square feet or 0.02 acres, more or less, of Lot 20, Block 777, Port Malabar Unit 16, according to the Plat thereof, as Recorded in Plat Book 15, Pages 84 thru 98, of the Public Records of Brevard County, Florida, for a constructed new single family residence use.

Mr. M. David Moallem (Erick Garcia Salas, Contineo Group and Cal Conner, U-Haul Co. of Eastern Florida, Reps.) have submitted for a Conditional Use to allow for self-storage facility in the CC, Community Commercial District. The 4.9-acre vacant unimproved property is generally located north of and adjacent to Hunter Ave NE, in the vicinity east of Sabal Palm Square, which is located at the southeast intersection of Palm Bay Road and Babcock Street NE. The owner has executed a cross-access agreement with Amerco Real Estate Company for use of the easement which starts at Palm Bay Road NE approximately 725 feet from Babcock Street and runs behind/east of the rear of U-Haul, located at 4703 Babcock Street NE.

BACKGROUND:

The request is to allow for a self-storage facility on vacant Community Commercial property which is approximately 4.9 acres. The subject property is generally located north of and adjacent to Hunter Ave NE, in the vicinity east of Babcock St. NE.

ANALYSIS:

Section 185.088(F) of the Code of Ordinances provides special requirements and conditions for establishment of self-storage facilities within the CC, Community Commercial zoning district.

The proposed location is prohibited from having doors facing residentially zoned properties other than ingress and ingress locations. The current proposal does not show any doors or ingress/egress locations facing any residentially zoned properties. The condition will be applicable to all future Site Plans associated with this Conditional Use.

Interior traffic lanes should be a minimum of 35' wide for two-way traffic and 25' for one-way traffic. The plan submitted does not indicate whether the traffic is one-way or two-way. A plan depicting minimum widths of 35' wide for two-way traffic and 25' for one-way traffic for Site Plan approval.

A landscaping plan will be reviewed during the Site Plan application and review by the Development Review staff.

CODE REQUIREMENTS:

To be granted Conditional Use approval, requests are evaluated upon items (A) through (I) of the General Requirements and Conditions of Section 185.087 of the Code of Ordinances. A review of these items is as follows:

Item (A): Adequate ingress and egress may be obtained to and from the property, with reference to automotive and pedestrian safety and convenience, traffic flow and control, and access in case of fire or other emergencies.

An easement dedication for ingress, egress and utility easement will need to be executed and recorded with the Brevard County Clerk of Court prior to granting approval of the Site Plan.

The ingress and egress point to the proposed location is not located off Right-of-Way. Additionally, the property will have two access points on the northwest corner and the north/northeast corner of the property.

Item (B): Adequate off-street parking and loading areas may be provided, without creating undue noise, glare, odor, or other detrimental effects upon adjoining properties.

Parking requirements and drive aisles will need to be engineered in accordance with the Land Development Code. This will allow for safe travel and pedestrian access throughout the property.

The traffic lanes will need to be 35' wide for two-way traffic and 25' for one-way traffic. The plans will need to indicate the proper width and direction of travel. If it is only one-way traffic, the plans will need to indicate that via traffic flow print on the plans.

Item (C): Adequate and properly located utilities are available or may be reasonably provided to serve the proposed development.

The proposed location is currently vacant. If developed, the owner/developer will be responsible for extending service to the site in accordance with current City regulations. All development would be required to go through Site Plan approval for all utility improvements to be made on the property.

Item (D): Adequate screening and/or buffering will be provided to protect and provide compatibility with adjoining properties.

This location will need to ensure proper buffering due to the property directly south being Multi-Family residential. Opaque fencing of 6' in height and landscaping will be required for proper screening and buffering.

Item (E): Signs, if any, and proposed exterior lighting will be so designed and arranged to promote traffic safety and to eliminate or minimize any undue glare, incompatibility, or disharmony with adjoining properties.

Upon Site Plan application, all signage and site lighting will be reviewed by appropriate staff. All applications will be in accordance with current City regulations.

Item (F): Yards and open spaces will be adequate to properly serve the proposed development and to ensure compatibility with adjoining properties.

Development Review staff will ensure adequate stormwater management for the proposed Conditional Use and a landscape plan signed and sealed by a Landscape Architect will need to be submitted and reviewed during the Site Plan review. **Item (G):** The proposed use will not constitute a nuisance or hazard because of the number of persons who will attend or use the facility, or because of vehicular movement, noise, fume generation, or type of physical activity.

The intensity of the proposed project should not create a nuisance or hazard to surrounding properties. If violations or hazards become a nuisance, this Conditional Use could be brought back before City Council for reconsideration, revocation, or additional conditions to be applied.

Additionally, this property will not be utilized for overflow parking or storage of U-Haul box trucks from the adjoining business.

Item (H): The use as proposed for development will be compatible with the existing or permitted uses of adjacent properties.

This area has similar commercial intensity and would be compatible for the proposed location.

Item (I): Development and operation of the proposed use will be in full compliance with any additional conditions and safeguards which the City Council may prescribe, including, but not limited to, a reasonable time limit within which the action for which special approval is requested shall be begun or completed, or both.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

CASE CU-3-2023 – Self-Storage Conditional Use

Engineering Comments (Natalie Shaber PE, City Engineer 321.890.4217):

Environmental report provided:

1. The GT survey shall be re-done by February 19th, 2023, and every 90 days until a site work permit has been issued.

2. Additional observation for nests is recommended prior to commencement of land clearing activities. Signage and protection measures for the Eastern indigo snake will need to be in place during construction.

Stormwater management:

1. All external agency permits shall be provided prior to scheduling a pre-sitework meeting.

2. All design and performance standards and specifications per Ch 62-330 F.A.C. shall be met for a site with direct discharge to an impaired waterbody and and Outstanding Florida Water including a nutrient analysis demonstrating the the post-development nutrient loads do not exceed the pre-development.

3. Please schedule a separate meeting with Public Works staff to discuss the potential for low impact development implementation and incentives.

4. Please provide sufficient topographical survey including off-site survey to demonstrate the direction of flow in the pre-development condition.

5. Provide a geotechnical report with borings that identify the SHWT and soil infiltration rates/ hydrologic soil units in the pre-developed condition.

6. Please use the drained condition in the pre-development calculations and undrained int he post-development.






SITE LOCATION MAP CASE: CU-3-2023



FUTURE LAND USE MAP CASE: CU-3-2023




ZONING MAP CASE: CU-3-2023





Motion to approve the minutes as presented.

 **CU-3-2023 - U-Haul Self-Storage - M. David Moallem (Erick Garcia Salas, Contineo Group and Cal Conner, U-Haul Co. of Eastern FL, Reps.) - A Conditional Use to allow a proposed self-storage facility in a CC, Community Commercial District, in accordance with Section 185.088 of the Palm Bay Code of Ordinances. Tax Parcel 528, Section 22, Township 28, Range 37, Brevard County, Florida, containing approximately 4.9 acres. Located north of and adjacent to Hunter Avenue NE, in the vicinity east of Babcock Street

Mr. White presented the staff report for Case CU-3-2023. Case CU-3-2023 met the minimum requirements for a Conditional Use request subject to the staff comments contained in the staff report, which are required to be addressed during Site Plan review. Mr. White noted that one of the conditions, the Cross Access Easement Agreement, was turned in to staff after the agenda was uploaded. The agreement was recorded by the Clerk of Court.

Mr. Warner asked if the project was an extension of the current business. Mr. White stated that it was a separate business with the same owners.

Mr. Erick Garcia-Salas, P.E., The Contineo Group, Atlanta, Georgia (representative for the applicant), gave an overview of the conditional use request. Mr. Garcia Salas indicated that the subject property, an empty island lot located behind Publix, would only have access through the U-Haul portion of the property into the U-Haul area. The primary use for the property was for U-Boxes, where persons would be able to store belongings, and it would not be open to the public. Mr. Garcia-Salas noted that it would be open for U-Haul employees, although further into the property there would be a component for drive-up self-storage. The property was in a secluded area, and did not front residential areas, with no future connections to Publix.

Mr. Boerema asked if there would be street entrances or exits to the east. Mr. Garcia-Salas indicated that there would be no street entrances or exits to the east and reiterated that the only access would be through the U-Haul portion.

Mr. Boerema inquired about the residential properties to the south. Mr. Garcia-Salas stated that the residential area to the south would be buffered by a stormwater retention pond.

Mr. Olszewski wanted to know if most of the square footage would be used by the U-Haul employees for moving the U-Boxes, and if customers would not be involved with the keeping of the U-Boxes. Mr. Garcia-Salas indicated that the U-Boxes would be in the north portion of the building and would be used by the employees, not the customers.

Mr. Olszewski asked if the self-storage component of the project was going to be like the current self-storage in the U-Haul parking lot. Mr. Garcia-Salas stated that self-storage would be drive-up, like the current self-storage.

Mr. Olszewski wanted to know how the project would be affected by the current Publix project. Mr. Garcia-Salas stated that there would be no effect on the purpose and overall look. Mr. Garcia-Salas described the screening, the location and access agreement of the project.

Mr. Boerema asked where the entrance to the project would be. Mr. Garcia-Salas stated that the entrance would be at the north end of the property.

Mr. Boerema wanted to know if there were any meetings with Publix. Mr. Garcia-Salas explained that U-Haul representatives met with the property owners and noted that everyone was aware and in full support of the project.

Motion to approve Case CU-3-2023 subject to the conditions in the Staff Report.

Motion by Mr. Weinberg, seconded by Mr. Olszewski. Motion carried with members voting as follows:

CROSS ACCESS EASEMENT AGREEMENT

OF FLORIDA 32, LLC, a Nevada limited liability company having a place of business at 2727 N. Central Avenue, Phoenix, AZ 85004, and AMERCO REAL ESTATE COMPANY, a Nevada corporation having a place of business at 2727 N. Central Ave., Phoenix, AZ 85004 (hereinafter referred to as "AREC").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC is the owner of certain property located in the City of Palm Bay, FL, commonly known as the U-Haul Center 781071 as more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto (the "U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property"), and Amerco Real Estate Company is the owner of certain property located in the City of Palm Bay, FL, commonly known as Palm Bay Hunter Ave. NE, Palm Bay, Florida as more particularly described in Exhibit B attached hereto (collectively the "AREC Property"); and

WHEREAS, the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property and AREC Property share a common boundary line; and

WHEREAS, U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32, LLC and AREC intend hereby to create and provide for the use and benefit of their respective properties, subject to the limitations hereinafter provided, a reciprocal, perpetual, non-exclusive casement for pedestrian and vehicular ingress, egress, passage and traffic between the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property and the AREC Property; and

WHEREAS, U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC and AREC intend that each of them, their respective successors in interest and their respective lessees, occupants, customers, employees, licensees, tenants and business invitees (the "Permittees") shall at all times enjoy the benefits of and shall at all times hold their interests subject to, the rights, easements, privileges and restrictions hereinafter set forth; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC and AREC do declare and agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 Usc/Access

1.1 Access Easement for U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC. AREC hereby grants to U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC for the use of U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC and its Permittees,

subject to all existing easements, encumbrances and restrictions of record, a perpetual, non-exclusive easement appurtenant to and for the benefit of the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property, upon, over and across the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Easement Area (as defined below) solely for the limited purpose of pedestrian and vehicular ingress, egress, passage and traffic between the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property and the AREC Property.

1.2 Access Easement for AREC Property. U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC hereby grants to AREC for the use of AREC and its Permittees, subject to all existing easements, encumbrances and restrictions of record, a perpetual, non-exclusive easement appurtenant to and for the benefit of the AREC Property, upon, over and across the AREC Easement Area (as defined below) solely for the limited purpose of pedestrian and vehicular ingress, egress, passage and traffic between the AREC Property and the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property.

1.3 Access Easement Areas. The Easement Area shall be located over, upon and across the U-HAUL CO. OF FLORIDA 32 LLC Property as described in Exhibit C attached hereto. Notwithstanding anything else herein to the contrary, subject to the limitations contained herein, each of the parties hereto reserves the right to construct buildings, landscaping, parking areas, driveways and other improvements on their respective properties which buildings, landscaping, parking areas, driveways and other improvements may not reduce the size of any easement areas located on their respective properties nor interfere with the reciprocal easement rights granted herein.

1.4 Use. Use of the Easement Areas by the benefitted parties is not hereby exclusively granted but shall be in common with the use thereof by the owners and Permittees of the property upon which the Easement Area is located. Each of the parties and their respective Permittees hereto shall be entitled to use those portions of the Easement Area which shall lie in their property for those uses provided herein and for any other reasonable uses so long as such other uses do not interfere with or obstruct the reasonable use of the Easement Area by the other party and its Permittees. Each party hereto shall specifically have the right to make any use of the subsurface of the Easement Area located on the property owned by them, at their sole cost and expense, so long as such use does not interfere with or obstruct the other party's reasonable use as provided herein.

Article II Maintenance

2.1.3 Maintenance of such appropriate parking signs and pavement markings, entrance, exit and directional signs and markers and lights so as to be uniform with those used on both properties.

2.1.4 Such painting and repainting of traffic lines and parking lines to maintain the Easement Area in first-class condition so as to be uniform with and provide for safe traffic flow between the subject properties.

2.1.5 Maintenance, repair and replacement of any drainage facilities located on each party's property so that any such facilities shall remain in good working order and condition.

Article III General Provisions

3.1 Not a Public Dedication. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall, or shall be deemed to, constitute a gift or dedication of any portion of the U-HAUL CO. OF FL 32 LLC Property or the AREC Property to the general public or for the benefit of the general public or for any public purpose whatsoever, it being the intention that this Agreement will be strictly limited to and for the purposes expressed herein. Each party hereto shall be permitted, from time to time, to take whatever reasonable action it deems necessary to prevent any portion of their respective properties from being dedicated or taken for public use or benefit.

3.2 Mortgage Subordination. Any mortgage or deed of trust affecting any portion of the Properties executed after this Agreement is recorded shall at all times be subject and subordinate to the terms of this Agreement, and any party foreclosing any such mortgage or deed of trust, or acquiring title by deed in lieu of foreclosure shall acquire title subject to all of the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

3.3 Termination by Merger. This grant of easement shall automatically terminate and become null and void upon the same person or entity attaining ownership of both the U-HAUL CO. OF FL 32 LLC Property and AREC Property.

3.4 Insurance. The respective property owners will at all times maintain or cause to be maintained with respect to the Easement Area commercial general liability insurance (including contractual liability coverage) against claims for bodily injury, death or property damage occurring on, in or about the Easement Area, combined single limit coverage of not less than ONE MILLION DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00) with respect to personal injury, and in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000.00) with respect to property damage.

3.5 Indemnity. The respective parties shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party and its directors, officers, agents, representatives, and employees harmless from and against any and all liens, liabilities, costs or expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and court costs), incurred in connection with, arising out of, occurring due to, or in any way related to the use of the easements herein granted, excluding, however, any personal injury or property damage to the extent the same is due to the negligence or willful misconduct of the other party.

Article IV Miscellaneous

4.1 Running of Benefits and Burdens. All provisions of this Agreement, including the benefits and burdens hereof, run with the land and are binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, assigns, successors, and personal representatives.

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4.2 Estoppel Certificates. Each party hereunder shall upon not less than thirty (30) days from receipt of written notice from the other party execute and deliver to such other party a certificate in recordable form stating that (i) either this Agreement is unmodified and in full force and effect or is modified (and stating the modification); and (ii) whether or not to the best of its knowledge the other party is in default in any respect under this Agreement and if in default, specifying such default.

4.3 Waivers - Remedies Cumulative. No delay or omission by any of the parties hereto in exercising any right or power accruing upon any noncompliance or failure of performance by the other parties under the provisions of this Agreement shall impair any such right or power or be construed to be a waiver thereof. The failure herein to specify a right, power or remedy accruing upon any non-compliance or failure of performance by any of the parties hereto shall not be construed to be a waiver thereof or an impairment of the rights of the party or parties thereby aggrieved to all remedies then available to it at law or in equity by reason of such non-compliance or failure of performance. A waiver by any of the parties hereto of any of the covenants, conditions or agreements hereof to be performed by one or more of the others shall not be construed to be a waiver of any succeeding breach thereof of any other covenant, condition or agreement herein contained.

4.4 Enforcement. The easements, restrictions and obligations created and imposed herein shall be effective upon the date hereof, shall run with the land, and shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors, successors-in-title, assigns and tenants, including any ground lessee under a ground lease. Said easements, restrictions and obligations shall be unaffected by any change in the ownership of any property covered by this Agreement or by any change of use, demolition, reconstruction, expansion or other circumstances, except as specified herein. Each of the rights created hereunder may be enforceable in a court of equity by the owner of any property covered by this Agreement and by any mortgagee of said property; however, enforcement hereunder shall be sought solely against the then owner of the property or parcel (or the owner of an interest in such property or parcel) alleged to be in default.

4.5 Construction of Agreement; Captions. This Agreement shall be construed under Arizona law, sets forth the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior agreements and memoranda with respect to the subject matter hereof. The captions used herein are used only as a matter of convenience and are not to be considered a part of this Agreement or to be used in determining the intent of the parties.

4.6 Notices. Any notice or other like communication from one party to another party pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be delivered by (i) hand, (ii) registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, or (iii) recognized overnight mail courier service (e.g. Federal Express, Airborne Express, DH), addressed to the owner of either property at the address listed on the assessor's field card as maintained by the County Assessor's Office.

Any notice sent pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been given (i) on the date the same was delivered by hand, (ii) two (2) business days after same was deposited in the United States Mail, registered or certified mail, with postage thereon fully prepaid, or (iii) one (1) business day after deposited with any applicable recognized overnight mail courier service sent via overnight delivery addressed as herein above provided.

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4.7 Amendments. This Agreement may be modified, amended, or cancelled only by a written instrument executed by the owners of each of the Properties at the time of such amendment.

4.8 Severability. If any term or provision of this Agreement, to any extent, shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining terms and provisions hereof shall not be affected thereby, but each such remaining term and provision shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

4.9 Attornevs' Fees and Costs. In the event of any controversy, claim, or dispute relating to this instrument or the breach thereof, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the losing party reasonable expenses, attorneys' fees and costs, whether or not suit is filed.

4.10 Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona.



WHEREAS, application for a conditional use in CC (Community Commercial District) zoning to allow for a self-storage facility on property legally described herein, has been made by M. David Moallem, and

- B. The Land Development Division Staff Report which is, by reference, incorporated herein as Exhibit 'B';
- C. The self-storage facility will not be utilized for overflow parking or storage of U-Haul box trucks from the adjoining business;
- D. The proposed location is prohibited from having doors facing residentially zoned properties other than ingress and egress locations;
- E. A six (6) foot high opaque masonry wall or fence shall be erected around the entire property boundary;
- F. The owner/developer will be responsible for extending service to the site in accordance with current City regulations;
- G. If violations or hazards become a nuisance, this Conditional Use could be brought back before City Council for reconsideration, revocation, or additional conditions to be applied; and
- H. All provisions of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Palm Bay and all other state and federal rules, regulations, and statutes.

SECTION 3. The conditional use must be commenced within one (1) year from

the effective date of this resolution. Commencement shall mean the issuance of the

appropriate development permit(s), which must remain active. Failure to commence

within one (1) year of issuance of the first permit shall void the conditional use.

SECTION 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon the enactment

date.

RE: Ordinance 2023-16, amending the City's Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map to change the designated use of property located north of and adjacent to Micco Road, in the vicinity east of Interstate 95 Highway, from Micco Park Village District to Parkway Flex Use (353.47 acres) (Case CP-2-2023, Peat Holding, LLC/Brian Lulfs, Managing Member), first reading.

Applicant Brian Lulfs, Managing Member of Peat Holdings, LLC (Jake Wise, P.E., Construction Engineering Group, LLC) submitted a large-scale Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map amendment from Micco Park Village Use to Parkway Flex Use for approximately 353.47 acres, generally located north of and adjacent to Micco Road SE, in the vicinity east of Interstate 95 Highway.

The intended use for the 353.47-acre property is a Parkway Flex Use development to be known as Lulfs Parcel. The proposed land use amendment would be considered compatible, as the diversity and mixture of residential and non-residential uses provides for a more efficient distribution of compatible land uses and further addresses the long-term responsible growth of the City by providing residents with diverse housing options, to include 184.1 acres of single-family residential and 30.9 acres of multi-family residential). Lulfs Parcel is intended to be a walkable community with 12.6 acres of landscape buffers and pedestrian connectivity. The project will also provide approximately 10.8 acres of commercial activity directly accessible to the residential development. Specifically, the commercial will be located on the western side of the proposed St. Johns Heritage Parkway (SJHP) extension east of Interstate 95. Additionally, the project proposes 11.2 acres of commercial land along the eastern side of the SJHP to capture trips generated from the northern adjacent developments. The proposed distribution of uses across this project area is conceptually depicted in Exhibit A, attached.

Please note that the School Concurrency letter from Brevard Public Schools projects that Sunrise Elementary School, Southwest Middle School, and Bayside High School are not projected to have capacity in the concurrency service area. The adjacent concurrency area is projected, at this time, is projected to have capacity at Stone Magnet Middle and Palm Bay Magnet Senior High; however, there is a shortfall of capacity for the concurrency area and adjacent concurrency area for elementary schools. To receive site plan approval, the development is required to contact BPS to discuss a mitigation process for final school concurrency determination.

BACKGROUND:

The subject properties are generally located north of and adjacent to Micco Road SE in the vicinity east of Interstate 95 Highway and is approximately 353.47 acres.

ANALYSIS:

Per Chapter 183: Comprehensive Plan Regulations, Section 183.01(B), the purpose and intent of the Comprehensive Plan is to encourage the most appropriate use of land and resources to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

1. FUTURE LAND USE ELEMENT

The Comprehensive Plan (Plan) FLU Element Goal FLU-1 is to ensure a high-quality, diversified living environment through the efficient distribution of compatible land uses.

The Comprehensive Plan (Plan) FLU Element Goal FLU-2 is to provide for and maintain viable neighborhoods and residential development to meet the existing and future needs of the residents of Palm Bay.

The Comprehensive Plan (Plan) FLU Element Goal FLU-3 Provide for economically viable commercial areas which promote a sound and diversified local economy and serve the retail and service needs of the City's residents.

The Comprehensive Plan (Plan) FLU Element Goal FLU-8 is to provide for a diverse and self-sustaining pattern of land uses that support the present and future population of the City of Palm Bay.

The intended use for the 353.47-acre property is a Parkway Flex Use development to be known as Lulfs Parcel. The proposed land use amendment would be considered compatible, as the diversity and mixture of residential and nonresidential uses provides for a more efficient distribution of compatible land uses. Moreover, it further addresses the long-term growth of the city by providing residents with diverse housing options (i.e. single-family and multifamily). In addition to these aspects, Lulfs Parcel is intended to be a walkable community with 12.6 acres of landscape buffers and pedestrian connectivity. The project will also provide commercial activity directly accessible to the residential property with the 10.8-acre tract of land designated for commercial use on the western side of the proposed St. Johns Heritage Parkway extension. It additionally further provides 11.2 acres commercial land along the eastern side of the highway to capture trips generated north from adjacent developments. The proposed distribution of uses across this project area is conceptually depicted in Exhibit A attached along with this staff report.

2. CONSERVATION ELEMENT

The environmental character of the city is maintained through conservation, appropriate use, and protection of natural resources.

The subject property is not located within any of the Florida scrub-jay polygons identified in the City's Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP). Any protected species that would be found on the subject property

would need to be mitigated as required by State and Federal regulations and per Comprehensive Plan Policy CON-1.7B.

Coastal Management: The subject property is not located within the Coastal Management Area.

3. HOUSING ELEMENT

The proposed FLU amendment does not adversely impact the supply and variety of safe, decent, attractive, and affordable housing within the city.

Housing Goal 1 - Provide for sufficient supply and variety of safe, decent, attractive and affordable housing, at locations which provide for convenient access to municipal facilities and services and which minimize impacts on the physical environment.

The proposed conceptual plan (Exhibit A) depicts a mixture of single-family and multifamily uses with approximately 184.1 acres and 30.9 acres of land designated for each use respectively. Furthermore, the intention is that there will be 12.6 acres of landscape buffers and pedestrian connectivity to establish a walkable community, which will provide for convenient access to commercial activities on the western side of the proposed St. John's Heritage Parkway extension.

4. INFRASTRUCTURE ELEMENTS

The city evaluates present and future water, sewer, drainage, and solid waste and assesses the ability of infrastructure to support development.

Utilities: If developed, the owner/developer will be responsible for extending service to the site in accordance with current City regulations.

Drainage: If developed, a drainage plan must be prepared in accordance with current regulations and approved by the City, along with appropriate outside agencies, including the St. Johns River Water Management District. Any proposed stormwater management system will be reviewed and approved by the City during the site plan review process

5. INTERGOVERNMENTAL COORDINATION ELEMENT

Public Schools: The proposed Future Land Use Map amendment alters the distribution of entitled residential land. The parcels under review are increasing the maximum density through the proposed land use change, which will add housing units. Some impacts to the public-school system area are anticipated. Considering the adjacent concurrency service areas, there is sufficient capacity at the high school level. However, there is an anticipated shortfall of capacity within the adjacent concurrency areas for the elementary and middle school levels. Nevertheless, the school district condition is to have the applicant contact staff to discuss the mitigation process as defined in Section 13.5 of the ILA-2014 prior to submitting for a final concurrency determination.

6. RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE ELEMENT

The proposed FLU amendment would increase the demand for recreation services as compared to

the existing public needs, due to potential increase in density.

However, the requested use would not exceed the existing parkland or recreational level of service standards for the planning area and will be providing parkland, recreational activity, and open/civic space within the bounds of the project area.

7. TRANSPORTATION ELEMENT

The objectives of the Comprehensive Plan's Transportation Element are to provide a safe, balanced, efficient transportation system that maintains the roadway level of service and adequately serves the needs of the community. If developed, a traffic impact analysis will be required to determine any negative impacts on the existing transportation system along with any suggested improvements, which will be taken under consideration during the Site Plan review/approval process.


8. PROPERTY RIGHTS ELEMENT


The goal of the Comprehensive Plan's Property Rights Element is for the City to respect judicially acknowledged and constitutionally protected private property rights.






Subject Property

The School Impact Analysis of this proposed development has been undertaken and the following information is provided for your use.

The calculations used to analyze the prospective student impact are consistent with the methodology outlined in Section 13.2 and Amended Appendix "A"-School District Student Generation Multiplier (approved April 11, 2022) of the *Interlocal Agreement for Public School Facility Planning & School Concurrency (ILA-2014)*. The following capacity analysis is performed using capacities/projected students as shown in the *Brevard County Public Schools Financially Feasible Plan for School Years 2022-23 to 2027-28 which* is attached for reference.

At this time, Sunrise Elementary School, Southwest Middle School and Bayside High School are not projected to have enough capacity for the total of projected and potential students from the Micco Park Village District development. Because there is a shortfall of available capacity in the concurrency service area, the capacity of adjacent concurrency service areas must be considered.



Held on Wednesday, March 1, 2023, in the City Hall Council Chambers, 120 Malabar Road SE, Palm Bay, Florida.

This meeting was properly noticed pursuant to law; the minutes are on file in the Land Development Division, Palm Bay, Florida. The minutes are not a verbatim transcript but a brief summary of the discussions and actions taken at this meeting.

Chairperson Leeta Jordan called the meeting to order at approximately 6:00 p.m.

Mr. Ranier Warner led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES:

1. Regular Planning and Zoning Board/Local Planning Agency Meeting 2023-02; February 1, 2023.

Motion to approve the minutes as presented.

2. CP-2-2023 - Micco Park Village - Brian Lulfs, Managing Member of Peat Holdings, LLC (Jake Wise, P.E., Construction Engineering Group, LLC) - A large-scale Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map amendment from Micco Park Village Use to Parkway Flex Use. Tax Parcels 500 and 751 of Section 12, Township 30, Range 37 along with Tax Parcel 2 of Section 13, Township 30, Range, 37, Brevard County, Florida, containing approximately 353.47 acres. Located north of and adjacent to Micco Road SE in the vicinity east of Interstate 95 Highway

Mr. Anderson presented the staff report for Case CP-2-2023. Case CP-2-2023 met the minimum criteria for a large-scale Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map Amendment request.

Mr. Good inquired if the plan for the area was a higher density zoning. Mr. Anderson stated that the Micco Park Village District already had entitlements through the adoption of the Comprehensive Plan. He noted that if you were to look at the adopted current plan versus what had been proposed you would notice that Micco Park Village had not changed in any way. If the applicant wanted to change the entitlements, they would have to come forward and make an application.

Mr. Warner wanted to know how this project changed from the original Micco Park Village District in the newly adopted Comprehensive Plan. Mr. Anderson stated that the area was going to be significantly less intense and less dense.

Mr. Karaffa wanted to know if there would be a school inside the project. Mr. Anderson explained that there had not been any discussions for a school site for the project and mentioned that the School Concurrency Application indicated that they were greenlighted for the next phase. He mentioned that it would be unlikely that the subject project would require a school site because of the proximity to the previous Micco Village District project that included a school site.

Mr. Olszewski wanted to know if there was any other project that existed in the City that was designated Parkway Flex District. Mr. Anderson stated that there was, and that it was located in the northwestern portion of the City near the St. Johns Heritage Parkway Extension area. Mr. Olszewski wanted to know how long the Parkway Flex Use existed. Mr. Anderson noted that it had existed since 2016.

Mr. Jake Wise, P.E. Construction Engineering Group, LLC (civil engineer for the project and representative for the applicant) introduced the developer for the project, Mr. James Gielda, Chief Development Officer, Lotis Group. Mr. Gielda informed the board of he and his partners years of experience in developing in Florida, and he looked forward to being in Palm Bay.

Mr. Olszewski asked when Lotis Group got involved in the project. Mr. Gielda explained that the property was owned by an investment partner for about 5 or 6 years. Mr. Olszewski wanted to know how dependent the project was on Emerald Lakes occurring. Mr. Gielda explained that the project was not 100 percent dependent on Emerald Lakes and that the primary reason was the Emerald Lakes property to the north already had public right-of-way dedicated to the City which would allow legal access to extend I-95 through the subject property for additional right-of-way dedication. Mr. Olszewski asked if Mr. Gielda was personally aware of how the existing St. John's Heritage Parkway had got there. Mr. Gielda explained that he was aware of the history.

Mr. Wise showed slides of the Master Plan of Micco Park Village District and gave details of the project. He noted that the eight criteria that staff mentioned in the staff report for Land Use approval were met. A Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) meeting was held and there were no attendees. Mr. Wise stated that the proposed land use would require 40 square feet of commercial land for every residential unit. He noted that the project was proposing 80,000 square feet of commercial. Mr. Wise mentioned that there were two lakes that encompassed almost 75 acres of the property and would total 100 acres of the project with the Parkway. The master plan reshaped the area and included pedestrian

interconnectivity and recreational amenities. Mr. Wise noted that Brevard County Environmental Endangered Lands (EELS), that would be preserved in perpetuity, abuts the property to both the east and west.

The floor was opened for public comments, and there was no correspondence in the file.

Mr. Bill Battin (resident at Ocean Spray Street SW) spoke in favor of the request. Mr. Battin stated that he was speaking in favor of the project because of the previous approval of the Micco Park Village to the east. He noted that without approval of the subject request, Micco Park Village would fail. Mr. Battin stated that the City would fail on the St. Johns Heritage Parkway unless there was some kind of agreement between the developers that were involved. Mr. Battin wanted to know how the pedestrians were supposed to get across the St. Johns Heritage Parkway since it was supposed to be a walkable community. Mr. Battin appreciated the fact that the developer had gone into neighborhoods where equestrian communities were a high priority. He hoped that the project would succeed.

Mr. Wise responded to Mr. Battin's questions. He stated that they understood that it would be developer dollars driving the extension of the Parkway and utilities.

The floor was closed for public comments, and there was no correspondence in the file.

Motion by Mr. Weinberg, seconded by Mr. Warner to approve Case CP-2-2023.

Ordinance 2023-17, amending the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 185, Zoning Code, RE: Subchapters 'District Regulations' and 'Conditional Uses', by modifying provisions related to self-storage facilities (Case T23-0003 (formerly T-23-2023), City of Palm Bay), first reading. (Councilman Johnson)

A Textual Amendment to the Code of Ordinances, Title XVII, Land Development Code, Chapter 185: Zoning Code, Section 185.088, Special Requirements and Conditions; Section 185.045 LI – Light Industrial and Warehousing District; Section 185.046 HI – Heavy Industrial District; and Section 185.054, GC – General Commercial District; to amend the locations, requirements, and conditions for self-storage facilities. (Councilman Johnson)

The applicant for this amendment is the City of Palm Bay, Florida. The applicant seeks to provide additional requirements for consideration when a conditional use for a self-storage facility is requested, and to amend the zoning classifications where a self-storage facility can be developed as a permitted use.

Currently, the City's Land Development Code allows self-storage facilities as a permitted use in the General Commercial (GC) district, and as a conditional use in the Highway Commercial (HC), Community Commercial (CC), and the Planned Commercial Development (PCD) districts.

The proposed changes will add self-storage facilities as a permitted use in the Light Industrial and Warehousing (LI) and Heavy Industrial (HI) districts. The proposed changes also amends the General Commercial (GC) district, allowing self-storage facilities only by conditional use, subject to Section 185.088(F) Special Requirements and Conditions.

In addition, Section 185.088(F) Special Requirements and Conditions is being amended to facilitate appropriate site development and sizing of self-storage facilities seeking a conditional use in the commercial districts. These changes provide for commercial activity and connectivity in the commercial districts while providing options for self-storage facilities within the community, specifically in relation to residential development.

BACKGROUND:

A Textual Amendment to the Code of Ordinances, Title XVII, Land Development Code, Chapter 185: Zoning Code, Section 185.088, Special Requirements and Conditions; Section 185.045 LI – Light Industrial and Warehousing District; Section 185.046 HI – Heavy Industrial District; and Section 185.054, GC – General Commercial District; to amend the locations, requirements, and conditions for self-storage facilities. See proposed changes below:

The applicant for this amendment is the City of Palm Bay, Florida. The applicant seeks to provide additional requirements for consideration when a conditional use for a self-storage facility is requested, and to amend the zoning classifications where a self-storage facility can be developed as a permitted use.

Proposed language for this amendment is attached in legislative style with additions between >>arrow<< symbols and deletions in strikethrough format.

PURPOSE:

The city zoning code is based on, consistent with, related to and adopted to effectuate and implement the policies of the city comprehensive plan in order to protect, preserve and improve the public health, safety, order, appearance, convenience and welfare of the inhabitants of the city, including, but not limited to:

- (A) Lessening congestion in the streets;
- (B) Encouraging the most appropriate use of land, water and resources;
- (C) Providing adequate light and air;
- (D) Securing safety from fire and other dangers;
- (E) Preventing the overcrowding of land;

(F) Presenting the character and stability of residential, commercial, industrial and other areas;

(G) Facilitating the adequate provisions for transportation, water supply, sewerage, drainage, sanitation, recreation, schools, housing, and other services; and

(H) Conserving and enhancing the standard of living within the city.

Each section being amended also has a specific intent and applicability.

The purpose of the Special Requirements and Conditions is:

For those conditional uses listed, special requirements shall apply in addition to those of Section 185.087.

The purpose of the LI – Light Industrial and Warehousing District is:

The provisions of this district are intended to apply to an area which can serve light manufacturing, warehousing, distribution, wholesaling and other light industrial functions for the city and the region. Lot sizes and other restrictions are intended to ensure sufficient open space and minimize adverse impacts of industrial uses off site and to nonindustrial uses.

The purpose of the HI – Heavy Industrial District is:

The provisions of this district are intended to apply to an area in close proximity to major transportation facilities and which can serve general manufacturing, storage and distribution needs of the city and region. Lot sizes and other restrictions are intended to minimize adverse impacts to adjacent properties.

The purpose of the GC – General Commercial District is:

The purpose of the General Commercial District shall be to locate and establish areas within the city which are uniquely suited for heavy commercial development. Such areas are to be developed in an intensive manner and are designed to provide opportunities for small businesses of a variety of types. The uses and development standards included in the district are intended to provide additional opportunities for businesses to locate within the city by providing a mix of service, warehousing, commercial, wholesaling, storage, and similar businesses and uses.

ANALYSIS:

Self-storage facilities can currently be developed as a permitted use in the General Commercial (GC) district, and as a conditional use in the Highway Commercial (HC), Community Commercial (CC), and the Planned Commercial Development (PCD) districts. Although self-storage facilities provide a service to the surrounding community, they do not provide many jobs or support the local economy when compared to other commercial uses such as restaurants, retail, or office space. Traditionally, self-storage facilities have also taken up larger plots of land.

The proposed changes, as textually written below, will add self-storage facilities as a permitted use in the Light Industrial and Warehousing (LI) and Heavy Industrial (HI) districts. In the General Commercial (GC) district, self-storage facilities will become a conditional use subject to Section 185.088(F), Special Requirements and Conditions. In addition, Section 185.088(F) is being revised to facilitate appropriate site selection and sizing of self-storage facilities seeking a conditional use in the commercial districts. These changes aim to enhance

economic activity and connectivity in the commercial districts while providing options for selfstorage facilities within the community.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Case T23-00003 is recommended for approval.

TITLE XVII: LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE

CHAPTER 185: ZONING CODE

§ 185.088 SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS AND CONDITIONS.

For those conditional uses listed below, the following special requirements shall apply in addition to those of § 185.087:

(A) Churches. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) The site has direct access to a collector or arterial roadway.

(2) Minimum setbacks shall be twenty (20) feet from all property lines or the minimum setback of the district, whichever are greater.

(3) Proposed sites not having direct access to a collector or arterial roadway must prepare a traffic impact study, approved by the City Engineer, to support the compatibility of the church use with surrounding uses. In addition, day care centers and schools are not permitted as accessory uses on these sites.

(4) Minimum size: one (1) acre.

(B) Clubs, lodges and similar activities. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) The site has direct access to a collector or arterial roadway.

(2) Minimum setbacks shall be twenty (20) feet from all property lines or the minimum setbacks of the district, whichever are greater.

(3) Minimum size: one (1) acre.

(C) Commercial dog kennels. A conditional may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) No structures, pens, or runs shall be located within fifty (50) feet of any property line.

(2) Open kennels must be visually screened from off-site view.

(3) The site is a minimum of one (1) acre in size.

(D) Planned industrial development. Development of industrial use or group of industrial uses of five (5) or more acres intended to be developed according to a carefully drawn plan, may be permitted by the City Council as a conditional use, after review by the Planning and Zoning Board, in the LI and HI zoning districts. This provision is intended to encourage better organization and controlled development for land reserved primarily for industrial uses, to create a compatible environment for a variety of industrial activities, to protect the integrity of surrounding residential and commercial uses, to allow and encourage proper placement and design for those commercial and residential uses which augment the principal uses, and to discourage commercial and residential encroachment upon areas which should be reserved for industrial activities. In order to qualify for such conditional use, the following conditions must be met:

(1) Ownership. The site proposed shall be in one (1) ownership, or, if in several ownerships, the request for conditional use shall be filed by all owners of the properties included in the plan.

(2) Zoning provisions. All other portions of the respective zoning district regulations and all other applicable portions of this chapter.

(3) Street frontage. The site proposed shall have a minimum width of two hundred (200) feet along a major street frontage.

(4) Access limitations. The minimum distance between access points shall be at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet, and the minimum distance between any one (1) location and an intersection of two (2) or more street rights-of-way shall be one hundred (100) feet.

(5) Site plan.

(a) Concurrent with the request, a site plan, shall be submitted on which structures shall be located in relation to:

1. Each other and to major entrances into and off the site;

- 2. Internal circulation ways;
- 3. Parking and service areas; and
- 4. Landscaped areas.

(b) The site plan and supporting data shall also show proposed standards for development, including restrictions of the use of property; plans for the provisions of utilities, including water, sewer and drainage facilities; plans for protection of abutting properties; plans for cross access and/or shared parking areas; and such other plans, tabulations and other data that the City Council may require.

(6) Tree regulations. Full compliance with the city tree regulations set forth in this chapter, in Chapter 180 and in any other applicable ordinance of the city must be assured.

(7) Office/business parks. All office/business park proposals must provide a list of prohibited and permitted uses in the proposed business park. The applicant should also address how the development will be designed and regulated to ensure the compatibility of uses within the office/business park.

(E) Public and private schools. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) The proposed site is located on a collector or arterial roadway;

(2) Minimum setbacks shall be twenty (20) feet from all property lines or the minimum setbacks of the district, whichever are greater;

(3) Minimum size, one (1) acre.

(F) Self storage facilities may be granted with the following conditions:

>>(1) Design standards. The following minimum design standards shall apply to the construction of new self-storage facilities or, to the maximum extent feasible, the expansion or redevelopment of existing self-storage facilities.<</p>

>>(a)<< (1) No door openings for any storage unit with the exception of emergency egress doors shall be constructed facing any residentially zoned property.</p>

>>(b)<< (2) The submitted conditional use site plan shall include a landscape plan.</p>

>>(c)<< (3) Interior traffic lanes shall be a minimum of thirty-five (35) feet wide for twoway traffic and a minimum of twenty-five (25) feet for one-way traffic, in order to accommodate loading and unloading as well as through and/or emergency traffic.

>>(d)<< (4) The maximum storage unit size is limited to 300 square feet.</p>

>>(e)<< (5) There shall be no outside storage at the site.</p>

(6) There shall be no storage of hazardous or flammable chemicals as determined by the Fire Marshal.

(7) Such facilities may only be utilized for storage. Occupancy for any other use is prohibited.

>>(f) No roll up door openings for any storage unit shall be constructed facing any right-of-way.

(g) Properties with the principal use as self-storage may locate along major collector or higher classified roads. For locations on lower classified roads, ground floor retail is required, or the building shall be setback from the roadway.

(h) Exterior surface materials of the primary/street facade shall be select high quality, human-scale building materials to reduce building massing and create visual interest.

(i) The base of a building (the first two to five feet above the sidewalks) shall be differentiated from the rest of the facade with treatments such as change in material and/or color.

(j) The primary/street facade of buildings shall incorporate no less than two (2) building materials including, but not limited to, tile, brick, stucco, cast stone, stone, formed concrete or other high-quality, long-lasting masonry material over a minimum seventy-five (75) percent of the surface area (excluding windows, doors and curtain walls.) The remainder of the wall area may incorporate other materials.

(k) Self-storage facilities resembling long, traditional warehouse buildings are prohibited. Self-storage facilities must be designed to emulate multi-family or office buildings compatible and in harmony with the surrounding area.

(2) Operational requirements. The following minimum operational standards shall apply to self-service storage facilities and tenants of individual storage units:

(a) Individual storage units shall not be used for activities such as residences, offices, workshops, studios, or hobby or rehearsal areas. Further, storage units shall not be used for manufacturing, fabrication or processing of goods, services or repair of vehicles, engines, appliances or other equipment, or any other industrial activity whatsoever. In addition, storage units shall not be used for commercial activity or places of business of any kind including, but not limited to, retail sales, garage or estate sales, or auctions, unless done so by the property management company. (b) Storage of flammable, explosive, perishable or hazardous materials within individual storage units and on site is prohibited.

(c) Rental agreements shall provide tenants with written notice of the minimum operational standards set forth in this section and any other conditions imposed by the city.<<</p>

(G) Communication towers and facilities. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) A map showing the closest existing communication towers shall be provided.

(2) The applicant has supplied a written affidavit that co-location of antennas or other communication facilities is not possible in any other zoning district where these facilities are permissible.

(3) If camouflaging is required, then tower or facilities must be camouflaged as required by City Council. An elevation view of this structure shall be provided.

(4) The applicant has obtained written confirmation that the communication facility meets FCC and FAA radio frequency emission and lighting standards.

(5) The submittal conditional use site plan includes a landscape plan that shows the landscape buffer and its irrigation as per Section 186.07(E) of the Palm Bay Code of Ordinances.

(6) No fence gates, equipment structure doors, or driveways shall be constructed facing any residentially zoned property, or the gates may be offset or otherwise buffered as to not be directly viewed from the residential property. This alternative must be approved by the City Planner.

(H) Eating and drinking establishments that allow patrons to dance to music. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) The applicant shall provide information and documentation that noise from the establishment will be abated so that the business will be in full compliance with Title IX: General Regulations, Chapter 92, Noise, Palm Bay Code of Ordinances.

(2) Methods of crowd control in both interior and exterior portions of the establishment shall be provided in the application.

(I) Security dwelling unit. A conditional use may be granted under the following conditions:

(1) The unit will only be permitted in conjunction with a site that has wholesale trade, warehousing, storage, contractor offices with storage, assembly, machine shops, commercial flex-space and/or similar uses.

(2) No one under the age of eighteen (18) may reside within the unit, and at no time may the unit be occupied by more than two (2) persons.

(3) The unit resident must be the owner of the property or an employee of the property owner. If the resident is not the owner, a signed and notarized contract between the property owner and the employee shall be provided to staff that addresses provisions for security.

(4) The unit may contain no more than one thousand (1,000) square feet of gross floor area and may not be located in a free-standing structure.

(5) There may be only one (1) security dwelling unit per property.

(6) There shall be at least one (1) parking space designated on-site for the resident of the unit.

(7) Applicants must demonstrate that approval of an onsite security dwelling minimizes the need for other security measures including but not limited to chain link fencing, strands of barbed wire atop fencing or walls and excessive security lighting thereby promoting a more aesthetically acceptable site development pattern.

(J) Wedding venues.

(1) The minimum size of a property for a wedding venue shall be five (5) acres.

(2) The subject property shall have direct access to a collector roadway or higher classification roadway.

(3) The structure used for wedding venues and the associated parking areas shall meet the setbacks established for principal structures of the RR District.

(4) The hours of operation shall be from sunrise to 11:00 P.M., not including venue setup and breakdown.

(5) Parking surfaces shall utilize stabilized materials and shall meet the provisions established in § 185.140(B)(1).

(6) A two-way driveway must be a minimum of twenty-four (24) feet in width at the right-of-way line and shall be paved from the right-of-way line to the edge of the roadway that the driveway connects to.

(7) A one-way driveway must be a minimum of fifteen (15) feet in width at the right- ofway line and shall be paved from the right-of-way line to the edge of the roadway that the driveway connects to.

(8) If a wedding venue chooses to have a sign, one detached sign shall be permitted for the venue site not to exceed six (6) feet in height, with a maximum sign area of sixteen (16) square feet, and setback a minimum of ten (10) feet from any property line.

(9) All site lighting is subject to the provisions established in § 185.143.

(10) All site noise is subject to the provisions established in Chapter 92.

(K) Event halls.

(1) The minimum size of a property for an event hall shall be five (5) acres.

(2) The subject property shall have direct access to a collector roadway or higher classification roadway.

(3) The structure used for event hall and the associated parking areas shall meet the setbacks established for the GC District.

(4) The hours of operation shall be from sunrise to 12:00 A.M. not including venue setup and breakdown.

(5) Parking surfaces shall utilize stabilized materials and shall meet the provisions established in § 185.140(C)(1).

(6) A two-way driveway must be a minimum of twenty-four (24) feet in width at the right-of-way line and shall be paved from the right-of-way line to the edge of pavement of the roadway that the driveway connects to.

(7) A one-way driveway must be a minimum of fifteen (15) feet in width at the right- ofway line and shall be paved from the right-of-way line to the edge of pavement of the roadway that the driveway connects to.

- (8) All site lighting is subject to the provisions established in § 185.143.
- (9) All site noise is subject to the provisions established in Chapter 92.

§ 185.045 LI — LIGHT INDUSTRIAL AND WAREHOUSING DISTRICT.

(A) *Intent.* The provisions of this district are intended to apply to an area which can serve light manufacturing, warehousing, distribution, wholesaling and other light industrial functions for the city and the region. Lot sizes and other restrictions are intended to ensure sufficient open space and minimize adverse impacts of industrial uses off site and to nonindustrial uses.

(B) Principal uses and structures:

(1) Warehousing within an enclosed structure.

(2) Wholesaling within an enclosed structure.

(3) Dry cleaning and laundry plants, printing plants, welding shops, machine shops, taxidermists and similar service and repair establishments and uses.

(4) Light manufacturing, processing and assembly including precision manufacturing, electrical machinery, instrumentation, bottling plants, dairy products plants, bakeries, fruit packing and similar uses.

(5) Building materials supply and storage, provided that any outside display and/or storage area shall be screened on all sides to avoid any deleterious impact on adjacent properties; includes contractor storage yards.

(6) Automotive, truck, major recreational equipment and mobile home sales, storage and repair establishment including, body shops, dry docking facilities, paint shops, upholstery shops and similar uses provided that outside storage of vehicles not for sale shall be effectively screened on four (4) sides so as to avoid off-site visual impacts.

(7) Vocational and trade schools.

(8) Veterinary hospitals and clinics including boarding of animals.

(9) Radio or television transmitter, towers or broadcasting facilities.

(10) Research and development facilities provided all activities are within an enclosed structure.

(11) Public utility equipment and facilities.

(12) Public uses.

(13) Communication towers and facilities.

(14) Medical Recycling Facility.

>>(15) Self-storage facilities.<<

(C) Accessory uses and structures:

(1) Customary accessory uses clearly incidental and subordinate to one (1) or more principal uses.

(2) Retail sales of products manufactured, processed or stored on the premises, provided the sales area constitutes no more than 15% of the total area of the space occupied by the business.

(3) Offices clearly accessory to one (1) or more principal uses.

(D) Conditional uses.

(1) Automotive fuel, propane, and natural gas dispensaries and refueling stations subject to the following provisions:

(a) Location of facilities: All pumps, storage tanks and other service island equipment shall be at least twenty (20) feet from all property lines, fifteen (15) feet from any building and one hundred (100) feet from the nearest residentially owned land. No pump, storage tank or other equipment shall be located closer than one thousand (1,000) feet from any municipal or public supply well.

(b) Liquid gasoline, liquid kerosene, or liquid diesel fuels may be stored onsite for use by the operator of the property and stored onsite for offsite delivery to the general public, and stored, dispensed, and sold onsite to the general public for onsite sales of such substances.

(c) Liquid and non-liquid propane, and liquid and non-liquid natural gas and other petroleum-based fuel products (including liquid gasoline, liquid kerosene, or liquid diesel fuel) may be stored onsite for the use of the operator of the property, stored and sold onsite for offsite delivery to the general public, and stored, dispensed, and sold onsite to the general property.

(d) The proposed use will not constitute a nuisance or hazard because of vehicular travel movement, delivery of fuel movement, noise or fume generation.

(e) Development and operation of the fuel pumps and attendant storage tanks shall be in compliance with $\frac{176.01}{2}$ et seq.

- (2) Freight handling and transportation terminals.
- (3) Planned industrial developments including office and business parks.
- (4) Corrections facilities subject to the following:
 - (a) Minimum area required: 20 acres.
 - (b) Shall not be located within 1,000 feet of any residentially zoned property.
- (5) Public and private schools.
- (6) Tree and landscape recycling, subject to the following:
 - (a) A minimum lot size of five (5) acres.
 - (b) An eight (8) foot opaque fence or wall surrounding the site on all sides.

(c) A one hundred (100) foot setback between any property line and any operation of tree or landscape recycling machinery (with the exception of vehicle or product storage).

(d) A two hundred fifty (250) foot buffer between any residentially zoned land and any operation of tree or landscape recycling machinery (with the exception of vehicle or product storage).

(e) Tree and landscape recycling operations restricted to 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

(f) Strict adherence to Maximum Permissible Sound Levels for Industrial Land, as set forth in Table 1 of § <u>92.06</u>, Palm Bay Code of Ordinances.

(E) Prohibited uses and structures:

(1) All uses not specifically or provisionally permitted herein.

(F) Lot and structure requirements:

- (1) Minimum lot area twenty thousand (20,000) square feet.
- (2) Minimum lot width one hundred (100) feet.
- (3) Minimum lot depth two hundred (200) feet.
- (4) Maximum building coverage fifty percent (50%).
- (5) Minimum floor area None.
- (6) Maximum height one hundred (100) feet.
- (7) Minimum yard requirements:

(a) Front — forty (40) feet minimum building setback, parking areas may be located in the front yard except within ten (10) feet of the front lot line.

(b) Side interior — twenty (20) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side yard except within ten (10) feet of the side lot line.

(c) Side corner — twenty-five (25) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side corner yard except within ten (10) feet of the side corner lot line.

(d) Rear — twenty-five (25) feet.

(8) An eight (8) foot high completely opaque masonry wall, or wood fence shall be provided along the entire length of any side or rear property line abutting property zoned residential. Landscaping shall be provided in accordance with the landscape requirements of this zoning code.

§ 185.046 HI — HEAVY INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.

(4) Light manufacturing, processing and assembly including precision manufacturing, electrical machinery, instrumentation, bottling plants, dairy products plants, bakeries, fruit packing, and similar uses.

(5) Building materials supply and storage, provided that any outside display and/or storage area shall be screened on all sides to avoid any deleterious impact on adjacent properties; includes contractor storage yards.

(6) Automotive, truck, major recreational equipment and mobile home sales, storage and repair establishment including, body shops, dry docking facilities, paint shops, upholstery shops and similar uses provided that outside storage of vehicles not for sale shall be effectively screened on four (4) sides so as to avoid off-site visual impacts.

(7) Vocational and trade schools.

(8) Veterinary hospitals and clinics, including boarding of animals.

- (9) Radio or television transmitter, towers or broadcasting facilities.
- (10) Research and development facilities.
- (11) Public utility equipment and facilities.
- (12) Freight handling and transportation terminals.
- (13) Printing, publishing and similar uses.
- (14) Textile and apparel manufacturing, processing and storage.
- (15) Lumber and wood products manufacturing, processing and storage.
- (16) Public uses.
- (17) Communication towers and facilities.
- (18) Salvage Yards.
- (19) Medical Recycling Facility.

>>(20) Self-storage facilities.<<

(C) Accessory uses and structures:

(1) Customary accessory uses clearly incidental and subordinate to one (1) or more principal used.

(2) Retail sales of products manufactured, processed or stored on the premises, provided the sales area constitutes no more than 15% of the total area of the space occupied by the business.

(3) Offices clearly accessory to one (1) or more principal uses.

(D) Conditional uses:

(1) Manufacturing, assembly and processing uses or facilities not specifically provided as a principal use including block and concrete plants, furniture factories, food processing, citrus processing plants, salvage yards, and canneries and similar uses.

(2) Storage of liquefied petroleum products.

- (3) Fabricated metal products.
- (4) Chemicals and similar products.

(5) Automotive fuel tanks and pumps subject to the following provisions:

(a) Location of facilities. Gasoline/ fuel pumps, storage tanks and other service island equipment shall be at least twenty (20) feet from all property lines, fifteen (15) feet from any building and one hundred (100) feet from the nearest residentially zoned land. No gasoline/fuel pump, storage tank or ether equipment shall be located closer than one thousand (1,000) feet from any municipal or public supply well.

(b) The use of fuel pumps shall be strictly limited to the owner of the property. Sales to members of the public in general or to any private individual are hereby strictly prohibited.

(c) The proposed use will not constitute a nuisance or hazard because of vehicular traffic movement, delivery of fuel movement, noise or fume generation.

(d) Development and operation of the fuel pumps and attendant storage tanks shall be in compliance with $\frac{176.01}{2}$ et seq.

(6) Planned industrial developments.

(7) Crematoriums.

(8) Corrections facilities subject to the following:

- (a) Minimum area required: 20 acres.
- (b) Shall not be located within 1,000 feet of any residentially zoned property.

(9) Smoke-producing industries, such as paper mills, rubber mills or regional incinerators, provided the land where such facility is operated shall be located no less than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile from the closest right-of-way line of Interstate 95.

(E) *Prohibited uses and structures:* All uses not specifically or provisionally permitted herein.

(F) Lot and structure requirements:

(1) Minimum lot area — thirty thousand (30,000) square feet.

- (2) Minimum lot width one hundred and fifty (150) feet.
- (3) Minimum lot depth two hundred (200) feet.
- (4) Maximum building coverage fifty percent (50%).
- (5) Minimum floor area None.
- (6) Maximum height one hundred (100) feet.
- (7) Minimum yard requirements:

(a) Front — forty (40) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the front yard except within ten (10) feet of the front lot line.

(b) Side interior — twenty (20) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side yard except within ten (10) feet of the side lot line.

(c) Side corner — twenty-five (25) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side corner yard except within ten (10) feet of the side corner lot line.

(d) Rear — twenty-five (25) feet.

(8) An eight (8) foot high completely opaque masonry wall, or wood fence shall be provided along the entire length of any side or rear property line abating property zoned residential. Landscaping shall be provided in accordance with the landscape requirements of this chapter.

(G) Lot and structure requirements for Salvage Yards:

- (1) Minimum lot area five (5) acres.
- (2) Minimum lot width two hundred (200) feet.
- (3) Minimum lot depth three hundred (300) feet.
- (4) Maximum building coverage fifty percent (50%).
- (5) Minimum floor area None.
- (6) Maximum height fifty (50) feet.
- (7) Minimum yard requirements:

(a) Front — forty (40) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the front yard except within ten (10) feet of the front lot line.

(b) Side interior — twenty (20) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side yard except within ten (10) feet of the side lot line.

(c) Side corner — twenty-five (25) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side corner yard except within ten (10) feet of the side corner lot line.

(d) Rear — twenty-five (25) feet.

(8) A six (6) foot high completely opaque masonry wall, or wood fence shall be provided along the entire length of any side or rear property line abating property zoned residential. Landscaping shall be provided in accordance with the landscape requirements of this chapter.

TITLE XVII: LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE

CHAPTER 185: ZONING CODE

§ 185.054 GC - GENERAL COMMERCIAL DISTRICT.

(A) Intent. The purpose of the General Commercial District shall be to locate and establish areas within the city which are uniquely suited for heavy commercial development. Such areas are to be developed in an intensive manner and are designed to provide opportunities for small businesses of a variety of types. The uses and development standards included in the district are intended to provide additional opportunities for businesses to locate within the city by providing a mix of service, warehousing, commercial, wholesaling, storage, and similar businesses and uses.

(B) *Principal uses and structures.* The following uses and structures are permitted:

(1) Professional offices (accounting, architecture, engineering, dentistry, medical, insurance, legal, real estate, financial services (non-banking) and similar uses).

(2) General offices (administrative, corporate, business and similar uses).

(3) Personal services (beauty, barber, dry cleaning pick-up and similar uses).

(4) Business services (graphic design, interior design, advertising, photography, printing, employment services, telemarketing, business schools and similar uses).

(5) Financial institutions (banks, credit unions and savings and loans).

(6) Retail sales and service (clothing, jewelry, luggage, shoes, electronics, sporting goods, books, gift shops, florists, photographic supplies, art dealers, tobacco products, grocery stores, drug stores, cosmetic and beauty supply, optical, specialty food and similar uses).

(7) Veterinarians and veterinary clinics.

(8) Schools licensed by the state of Florida.

(9) Day care centers licensed by the state of Florida.

(10) Public uses (any federal, state, county, municipal, special district or similar use).

(11) Funeral homes.

(12) Eating establishments (restaurants, coffee shops, pastry shops, ice cream parlors, cafeterias, snack shops and similar uses).

(13) Major retail sales, rental and service (building supply, major appliances, furniture, paint, hardware, lawn and garden supplies, consumer goods rentals and similar uses).

(14) Plant nurseries and greenhouses.

(15) Public utility facilities.

(16) Clubs, lodges and fraternal organizations.

(17) Building services (pest control, carpet cleaning, janitorial, water treatment, vending and similar uses).

(18) Contractors' offices (plumbers, electricians, carpenters, masons, roofers, builders, cabinet makers, fence installers, gutter and siding installers, flooring and tile installers, drywall installers, painters, heating and air conditioning installers, glass repair and replacement and similar uses).

- (19) Wholesale trade, warehousing and storage
- (20) Towing services with associated storage.
- (21) Upholstery and furniture repair/refinishing.
- (22) Medical and dental manufacturing labs.
- (23) Welding and machine shops.
- (24) Technical and trade schools.
- (25) Self-storage facilities.

(26)>>(25)<< Retail automotive sales, rental and service (car, boat, recreation vehicle, ATV, and motorcycle sales and service including paint, body and upholstery shops).

- (27)>>(26)<< Assembly of components manufactured off-site.
- (28)>>(27)<< State licensed tattoo parlors.
- (29)>>(28)<< Drinking establishments.

(30)>>(29)<< Indoor commercial recreation (excluding dance clubs). In buildings with multiple tenants, indoor commercial recreational uses may occupy up to five thousand (5,000) square feet of gross floor area.

(C) Accessory uses and structures. Customary accessory uses of one (1) or more of the principal uses, clearly incidental and subordinate to the principal use, in keeping with the high intensity commercial nature of the district. All storage shall be within an enclosed structure or completely screened by an opaque fence or wall, of at least six (6) feet in height.

- (D) Conditional uses.
 - (1) Permitted uses located on a parcel of ten (10) or more acres of area.
 - (2) Commercial towers.
 - (3) Security dwelling unit, subject to the provisions established in § <u>185.088</u>(I).
 - (4) Canine day care, and related services:

(a) There shall be no more than one (1) dog per thirty-five (35) square feet of the area within the facility that the dogs will be housed.

(b) The facility must have an outdoor area for exercise and bathroom relief. Said area shall be enclosed with a minimum six (6) foot tall fence.

(c) All kennels and housing areas shall be within an air-conditioned building. Outside kenneling will not be permitted.

(d) Fecal matter shall be disposed of on a daily basis.

(e) Dogs shall be indoors between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

- (5) Dancing in eating and drinking establishments.
- (6) Churches.
- (7) Event halls, subject to the provisions established in § <u>185.088(J)</u>.

(8) Indoor commercial recreation; occupying more than five thousand (5,000) square feet of gross floor area in buildings with multiple tenants.

>>(9) Self-storage facilities subject to the provisions established in § 185.088(F).<<

- (E) Prohibited uses and structures.
 - (1) All uses not specifically permitted herein.
 - (2) Pawn shops.
 - (3) Pain-management clinic.
- (F) Lot and structure requirements.
 - (1) Minimum lot area fifteen thousand (15,000) square feet.
 - (2) Minimum lot width one hundred (100) feet.
 - (3) Minimum lot depth one hundred fifty (150) feet.
 - (4) Maximum building coverage fifty percent (50%).
 - (5) Minimum floor area three hundred (300) square feet.
 - (6) Maximum height forty (40) feet.
 - (7) Minimum yard requirements:

(a) Front: thirty (30) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the front yard except within ten (10) feet on the front lot line.

(b) Side interior: ten (10) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side yard, except within five (5) feet of the side lot line.

(c) Side corner: twenty-five (25) feet minimum building setback. Parking areas may be located in the side corner yard, except within ten (10) feet of any street.

(d) Rear: ten (10) feet minimum building and parking setback.

(8) Shared access and parking areas.

(a) No side interior building and parking area setbacks are required provided all of the following are met:

1. Buildings on adjacent parcels, under separate ownership, are joined by a common wall;

2. Parking areas and aisles are joined with adjacent parcel(s) under separate ownership;

3. Curb cuts and driveways are shared in common parcels involved and a minimum spacing of one hundred (100) feet is maintained, or access is provided by an approved frontage road; and

4. Easements and/or written assurances of cross access and a sharing of common facilities (stormwater system, solid waste container(s), lighting, landscaping, etc.), as may be applicable, from all property owners involved must be approved prior to the issuance of a building permit.

(b) For adjacent developments meeting the requirements of divisions (F)(8)(a) 2. through 4. above, the total number of off-street parking spaces required for uses on all parcels involved may be reduced by ten percent (10%) where the location of shared parking areas provides convenient access to all principal buildings.

(9) Design requirements.

(a) An Architectural Style for each structure is required. This shall include adherence to all standards contained in § 185.134.

3. Discussion of directing the City Attorney to draft a letter to the Office of the Governor requesting the Governor suspend Councilman Peter Filiberto pursuant to Section 112.51, Florida Statutes. (Councilman Johnson) (AGENDA REVISION)

Ms. Smith presented the item to Council. She advised of Section 112.51, Florida Statutes, which provided the process by which a municipal officer may be suspended or removed from office by the Governor. City Council did not have the ability to remove another councilmember because they had been charged with a felony.

Mr. Johnson asked about absences from Council meetings. Mrs. Jones noted that pursuant to Section 3.063, of the Palm Bay City Charter, absence from four (4) consecutive regular meetings or a total of six (6) regular meetings within a 12-month period shall vacate the seat of the member.

Numerous individuals commented and felt that Mr. Filiberto should resign.

Motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Foster, to direct the City Attorney to draft a letter to the Office of the Governor requesting the Governor suspend Councilman Peter Filiberto pursuant to Section 112.51, Florida Statutes.

Mr. Foster said that Mr. Filiberto took an oath of office to uphold the Constitutions of the United States and Florida and he violated that oath. He requested Mr. Filiberto resign immediately.

Deputy Mayor Felix said Mr. Filiberto should do the right thing for himself, the city, and the residents and resign immediately.

Mayor Medina reiterated that the only authority Council had in this situation was to send a letter to the Governor requesting the suspension of their fellow councilman. He supported the motion.

Motion carried with members voting as follows: Mayor Medina, Yea; Deputy Mayor Felix, Yea; Councilman Johnson, Yea; Councilman Foster, Yea.

4. Discussion of immediate drug testing for councilmembers. (Mayor Medina) (AGENDA REVISION)

Mayor Medina presented the item to Council. He had researched that a Council in Burbank, California, had implemented quarterly drug testing for the councilmembers, and he wanted Council to consider a similar policy. Mayor Medina said it could not be mandated but urged Council to be transparent and volunteer to do so.

Individuals made comments stating that no one would see the results; questioning if the policy was for all employees and what corrective actions would be posed; a policy should not be set based on bad behaviors or criminal actions of one person; and why background checks and credit checks were not performed on candidates by the city.

Mayor Medina relinquished the chair to the Deputy Mayor and made a motion that City Council be subjected to drug testing on a voluntary, quarterly basis. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion.

Mayor Medina asked about background checks for members of Council. Ms. Smith explained that neither the City Clerk nor any other city official had the ability or authority to prevent a person from being placed on the ballot or stop them from being sworn into office. If someone felt that a person should be disqualified, a court order would be needed. Random urinalysis could be performed in the private sector, but a governmental agency would need a reason to do so. Drug tests were considered searches under the law, and it would be unconstitutional to randomly test employees or officials without having some suspicion that the person actually engaged in some type of drug use.

Mayor Medina said he wanted this to be voluntary, possibly every quarter and the councilmember could just disclose whether the test was a pass or fail. Mr. Johnson understood the intent but other than the voters being aware of the results, there was no other recourse should a councilmember fail the test. Mr. Foster disagreed with the testing and said that he was not going to give up his constitutional right because of Mr. Filiberto's mistake. The Unit 13 & 14, Madden Avenue and Osmosis Drive Road Paving Project is part of the G.O. Road Bond Paving program. These streets are part of Phase 3, which was endorsed by the Infrastructure Advisory & Oversight Board on November 22, 2021, and subsequently approved by City Council on February 3, 2022. The project consists of Full Depth Reclamation (FDR), mill and pave, and thin lift asphalt overlays within Units 13, 14, Madden Avenue and Osmosis Drive.

Three (3) bids were received, and the Procurement Department staff have reviewed the bids for responsiveness. The Public Works (PW) Department evaluated the bids for responsibility and ability to perform the work scope and found both the bids to be responsive. The PW Department found the lowest responsive bid from Timothy Rose Contracting, Inc. to be acceptable.

The City's Engineers Estimate for the project was \$12,431,825.57. The bid from Timothy Rose Contracting, Inc. is \$10,954,848.18. The Public Works Engineering Division staff has reviewed the pay items, proposed subcontractors, equipment list, and is satisfied with the evidence provided by the contractor. Staff recommends that Council award IFB# 21-0-2023 – Road Bond Paving – Units 13, 14, Madden Avenue and Osmosis Drive to Timothy Rose Contracting, Inc. located at 825 8th Street, Vero Beach, FL 32962.

Procurement solicited bids on behalf of the Public Works Department for culvert replacement at Walden Boulevard at C-42. This project is comprised of the removal, disposal, replacement, and restoration of culvert crossings along the Melbourne Tillman (MT) Water Control District (WCD) Canal on Walden Boulevard at C-42. During the bid process, Staff relayed that time is of the essence, and required that road closures be limited to a maximum of 30 days for the location. A detailed schedule of the road closure shall be furnished at the Preconstruction Meeting and updated monthly throughout the project. Public Works will work with the PIO to communicate the closure to the public.

Two (2) bids and one (1) no bid were received, and the Procurement Department staff have reviewed the bids for responsiveness. Public Works evaluated the bids for responsibility and ability to perform the work scope and found both the bids to be responsive. The Department found the lowest responsive bid to be acceptable.

The City's Engineers Estimate for the project was \$499,483.00. The bid from Timothy Rose Contracting, Inc. is \$476,555.90. Public Works Engineering staff has reviewed the pay items, proposed subcontractors, equipment list and is satisfied with the evidence provided by the contractor. Staff recommends Timothy Rose Contracting, Inc. located at 825 8th Street, Vero Beach, FL 32962, the award of IFB# 23-0-2023 – Walden Boulevard at C-42 Culvert Replacement.



RE: Contract: Voluntary supplemental insurance benefits, renewal - Human Resources Department (Life Insurance Corporation of North America (Cigna Group Insurance) -\$72,000 (employee-paid coverages)).

The City Manager executed an agreement effective January 1, 2019, for two calendar years through December 31, 2020, for Voluntary Supplemental Insurance. On January 21, 2021, City Council approved the renewal Voluntary Supplemental Insurance for 24 months with the provision that the contract would be reevaluated for the 2023 benefit year. The total renewal period would also cover the 2023 calendar year, if the City determined it to be in the best interest to continue. The City has reevaluated and recommends continuing to utilize the renewal for the 2023 benefit year.

The Human Resources Department provides voluntary supplemental benefits for City employees. These are 100% employee paid coverages. The current provider is Life Insurance Corporation of North America (Cigna Group Insurance). The current coverage includes three plans:

- Hospital Care (HC): The plan pays for qualifiable hospital confinements. Available for employees and their dependents.
- Accident Injury (AI): The plan pays employees cash benefit for expenses resulting from on or off the job injuries. The plan is also available for dependents.
- Critical Illness (CI): The plan pays cash benefits in the event the employee is diagnosed with an illness covered under this plan. Dependent coverage is also available.

Staff recommends the renewal of one additional year, with rate guarantee, established by contract for Voluntary Supplemental Insurance, AI, CI, and HC with Cigna Group Insurance, through December 31, 2023. This contract will be reevaluated by the City in 2023 for the 2024 benefit year.

REQUESTING DEPARTMENT:

Procurement, Human Resources

FISCAL IMPACT:

Supplemental insurance benefits are budgeted through Other Employee Benefits (OEB) account # 513-2531-519-45-15 with an approximate cost per year of \$72,000 and are 100% employee paid. This City serves as a

"pass through" for this service, collecting premiums from employees and remitting to the carrier on their behalf.

Motion to renew Voluntary Supplemental Insurance, AI, CI, and HC with Cigna Group Insurance for the 2023 benefit year.

RE: Contract: Citywide multi-function equipment, lease extension (Canon Financial Services Inc. (lease payments) - \$143,356; Dex Imaging LLC (maintenance costs) - \$69,305).

Staff is requesting to extend our five year copier lease for an additional three year (36 month) period. The City issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) #43-0-2018 for Citywide Multi-Function Products to reduce expenditures by having a set copier lease amount and a metered usage component. The RFP was broadcasted on May 24, 2018 and replaced the previous copier fleet. At the September 20, 2018 Regular Council Meeting, City Council approved a Notice of Award for Contract #43-0-2018, Multi-function Products for a five-year lease with Dex Imaging, LLC, based out of Tampa, Florida with a local Melbourne service office (formerly North American Office Solutions), which was set to expire on December 31, 2023.

The Canon copiers that the City currently leases are in good working condition; therefore, it is in the City's best interest to extend the lease and maintenance agreement for 36-months through February 28, 2026. The volatile market conditions occurring over the past several years continue to impact consumers with escalating costs. The City continues to experience difficulty receiving commodities, including those in technology sphere, in a timely fashion. Through research in to market conditions, Staff believes there is a risk the City could not secure a multifunction replacement fleet if the City resolicited at this time. Considering these pieces of equipment are used by all departments on a daily basis and that the current equipment is in good condition, an extension is in the City's best interests. The City will continue to pay the same rate for the lease and maintenance costs, essentially locking in our 2018 rates for a total eight year contract period.

Staff recommends approving the extension of the Canon lease payments and Dex Imaging maintenance costs for Contract #43-0-2018 Multi-function Products.

REQUESTING DEPARTMENT:

Procurement, Information Technology

FISCAL IMPACT:

The annual lease payments are \$47,785.44 for a total lease payment amount through the end of the 36-month extension of \$143,356.32. The maintenance costs per fiscal year, depending on usage, is estimated to be

\$23,101.76, totaling \$69,305.28 through the end of the 36-month extension. Both the lease payments and maintenance costs will be charged to various funds.

RECOMMENDATION:

Motion to approve a 36-month extension of lease payments and maintenance costs through February 28, 2026 to Canon Financial Services Inc. located in Chicago, IL, and Dex Imaging LLC located in Tampa, FL, respectively.

RE: Miscellaneous: 'Cooperative Purchase', tractor trade-in/tractor and slope mower purchase (Sourcewell contract) - Public Works Department (Everglades Equipment Group - \$230,825).

As part of Fiscal Year 23 Budget Submittal in May, staff included the Capital purchase request in the amount of \$209,273 for a tractor and slope mower. The current cost of the tractor and slope mower has since been quoted at \$262,825. Staff is asking to trade in tractors 6564, 6805 and 6806 bought in 2004 and 2007. These tractors have outlived their useful life with extensive repairs of approximately \$597,656 combined. They are determined to be beyond economical repairs.

Their current estimated values of these vehicles are not more \$15,000 each and the surplus process could bring substantially less. The vendor is offering \$12,000 for Asset #6564 and \$10,000 each for Assets #6805 and #6806, thus offsetting \$32,000 from the new tractor and slope mower cost.

Council approved \$54,509 in Fiscal Year 23 Budget account 461-7084-541-6401 Machinery and Equipment to procure a Thompson Pump. The cost of the pump was \$27,411 which is under the estimate. Staff is asking to use \$21,552 from the remaining funds of \$27,098 to offset the overage in the quote and trade-in for the tractor and slope mower.

The Sourcewell contract 080721-AGI is valid until August 9, 2025. The awarded vendor is Alamo, and Everglades Equipment Group is the authorized distributor. In accordance with the City's Code of Ordinance, Section 38.13(F)(4) Cooperative Purchases and Piggyback Purchases: The City may purchase from any cooperative contract, including but not limited to: term contracts by the State of Florida, Federal General Services Administration, and other governmental cooperatives and entities within and outside the State of Florida provided that the cooperative contract is established in compliance with the procurement procedures and requirements of the issuing body, entity, authority, or cooperative. If such other governmental or cooperative contract is utilized, the public notice requirements and the need to utilize the methods of selection processes are obviated. Any such contracts equal to or in excess of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall go to the City Council for approval.

Under the City's Stormwater Program, the Public Works Department is seeking approval to utilize Volusia County's contract for Polyethylene Pipe, contract #IFB 18-B-98KT awarded to Ferguson Enterprises, Inc., to furnish polyethylene pipes throughout Palm Bay. This contract is valid through June 18, 2023 and has a one-year renewal remaining. Initially the spend on this contract was less than \$100,000, however due to the 26% price increase on the products, beginning June 19, 2022, the City's spend is on track to exceed the threshold for City Council approval. Utilizing this contract provides the City with the opportunity to quickly move forward with replacing decaying pipes and adding new pipes needed for our growing infrastructure. Due to longer than normal delivery time, a stock is needed on hand for emergencies.

Public Works staff researched multiple vendors and determined that the City of Volusia contract best meets the polyethylene pipe demand for the City's Stormwater Program.

In accordance with the City's Code of Ordinance, Section 38.13(F)(4) Cooperative Purchases and Piggyback Purchases: The City may utilize (piggyback) a contract entered into by another governmental or public entity and a provider of supplies or services required by the City, if the Chief Procurement Officer determines that it is practicable and advantageous for the City to employ this method of purchase, and such contracts specify that they are cooperative procurements at the time of solicitation or the governmental entity Procurement official otherwise agrees to the use of such contract in writing. Any such contracts equal to or in excess of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall go to the City Council for approval.

Staff is requesting to utilize the Volusia County Contract # 18-B-98KT, which expires June 18, 2023, for the purchase of a polyethylene pipe from Ferguson Enterprises, Inc in Orlando, Florida.

The Public Works Director's vehicle was part of the City Manager's Office FY21-22 Unfunded Capital request that was approved 12/16/21 by council for \$45,000. The quote for the director's vehicle was \$28,122 leaving a balance of \$16,878.

The City received insurance proceeds for damage caused to a tractor, Vehicle 7193. Repair of the tractor was performed in house at a reduced rate leaving the amount of \$33,966 remaining which was reappropriated from the FY 22 budget to the Fleet Account.

Public Works is requesting to use the existing \$16,878 balance remaining from the purchase of the Director's vehicle as well as \$6,557.94 of the \$33,966 remaining from the insurance proceeds to procure a 2023 Ford Maverick Hybrid quoted at \$23,435.94. The quote is using the Volusia County School Board contract TR-2-009JH, which expires November 9, 2023, and which the City has used before to procure Police, Code, Building, and IT vehicles and finds it to be the most cost effective cooperative vehicle contract option. Because the total spend against this contract now exceeds \$100,000, Council approval is requested.

Public Works is requesting to use part of the remaining \$27,408.06 insurance proceeds to purchase bucket attachments for two excavators for Asset #6846 and #7052 totaling \$21,800. Per a sole source letter on file in Procurement, Ring Power is the sole authorized distributor for Caterpillar parts and equipment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, REDEFINING AND ESTABLISHING THE TERRITORIAL AND CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR THE CITY CLERK TO FILE SAID REDEFINITION OF THE CITY'S BOUNDARIES WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA, SECRETARY OF STATE; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CITY OF PALM BAY CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Palm Bay has annexed several parcels of land in the

corporate limits of the City of Palm Bay since the last annexation in 2015, and

WHEREAS, the annexation of these properties deems it necessary to redefine the

boundaries of the City of Palm Bay to include such properties, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Florida Statutes, Chapter 166.031(3), a

municipality may, by ordinance and without referendum, redefine its boundaries to include

the lands annexed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY

OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION 1. The territorial boundaries and corporate limits of the City of Palm

Bay, Florida, are hereby redefined and established as follows:

Begin at a point on the west channel of the Indian River which point of beginning is projected from and parallel with the north line of Section 31, Township 28 South, Range 38 East. From said point of beginning run west and along the north line of Section 31, said township and range, to its point of intersection with the western right of way of U.S. Highway No. 1 (Florida State Road No. 5, Road Section No. 70010-277 per right of way map dated 3-27-61); Thence run southerly along said western right of way a distance of 229.57 feet more or less to the point of intersection with the northerly boundary of Riverview Homes Subdivision as

- RE: Ordinance 2023-19, amending the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 34, Human Resources, Subchapter 'General Provisions', by including provisions for a general background check requirement and a special criminal history background check, first reading.

The Human Resources Administrative Code G.25.2. 10.5E(b) Employment Process, includes fingerprinting as part of the background check for selected applicants. Recently, while providing updated forms, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) notified the City that we were not eligible for the Volunteer and Employee and Criminal History System (VECHS). The VECHS program is for entities who provide care or care placement services specifically to children, the elderly or disabled as defined in FSS 943.0542. Because the City provide services to the general population, and not just the specific classes that VECHS is authorized for, the City is not eligible. At this time, Human Resources can only conduct an FDLE name search through FDLE. The results provided are for the state of Florida only.

Public Law 92-544 authorizes the dissemination of national criminal history record information (CHRI) to agencies seeking to screen applicants who are otherwise ineligible to be screened under a separate regulatory authority or through FDLE's VECHS Program. The City of Palm Bay is required to enact an ordinance that authorizes the national screenings. The authority to fingerprint comes from Section 166.0442, Florida Statutes, which also states an ordinance is required.

Approval of this Ordinance will allow the City of Palm Bay to request an FL9 Originating Agency Identifier (ORI) number with the proper program to resume fingerprinting of selected applicants.

WHEREAS, it is common practice and both appropriate and proper to require general background checks of all prospective City employees, and

WHEREAS, the City has conducted such general background checks for some time without any specific requirement being set forth in the City Code of Ordinances; and,

WHEREAS, Florida Legislature, Chapter 169 set forth in Section 166.0442, Florida Statutes, which authorizes specific criminal history checks for certain municipal employees and appointees, whether paid, unpaid, or contractual, the Florida Legislature has attempted to assist municipal governments in their efforts to ensure that City applicants, personnel, and other appointees to positions it deems critical to security or public safety have appropriate backgrounds to work in those positions, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Palm Bay, has determined it is in the best interest of the City and its citizens to require all appropriate and applicable background checks for all prospective City employees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM BAY, BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated by reference.

SECTION 2. The City of Palm Bay Code of Ordinances, Title III, Administration,

Chapter 34, Human Resources, Subchapter 'General Provisions', by creating Section

34.14, Recruitment and Examinations, which shall henceforth read as follows:

">>Section 34.14 RECRUITMENT AND EXAMINATIONS.

(A) Recruitment. The Human Resources Director shall give public notice of recruitment for examinations which are to be held for filling positions in classified service. The notice shall contain the time, place, date and requirements for the examinations. Applications for all positions of the classified service are to be submitted to the Human Resources Director on prescribed forms. All prospective employees shall be required to authorize the City to conduct all appropriate background screening procedures as a condition of employment with the City.

(B) Criminal History Records Check. In addition to the foregoing, as authorized in Section 166.0442, Florida Statutes, the City may, in its sole discretion, require employment screening for any position of municipal employment or appointment which the City determines is critical to security or public safety, or for any private contractor, employee of a private contractor. vendor, repair person, or delivery person who has access to any public facility or publicly operated facility that the City determines is critical to security or public safety. Each person applying for, or continuing employment in, any such position or having access to any such facility shall also be required to be fingerprinted. The fingerprints shall be submitted to the Department of Law Enforcement for a state criminal history record check and to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for a national criminal history record check. The information obtained from the criminal history record checks conducted pursuant to this Ordinance may be used by the municipality to determine an applicant's eligibility for employment or appointment and to determine an employee's eligibility for continued employment. This section is not intended to preempt or prevent any other background screening, including, but not limited to, criminal history background checks, that a municipality may lawfully undertake.<<"

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby

repealed and all ordinances or parts of ordinances not in conflict herewith are hereby

continued in full force and effect.





- RE: Consideration of submitting an application for Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program funds.

Under the U.S. Department of Energy's Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG), the City of Palm Bay is entitled to a direct formula allocation in the amount of \$160,090. The EECBG program goes back to the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, enacted in response to the "Great Recession" in the form of a stimulus package. Under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act 2021), Congress reauthorized the program at \$550 million, with allocations available to every state and local municipality. However, this is not a direct entitlement allocation, and the City must apply to utilize the funds.

The goal of the EECBG is to assist government entities in their efforts to reduce energy consumption and emissions through energy conservation. The City must apply for the for these funds by submitting a pre-award information sheet by April 28, 2023. Once submitted, the City has until January 31, 2024 at 8 AM to submit its final application.

Eligible uses of EECBG funds include the development of an energy efficiency and conservation strategy; retention of a technical consultant to assist in the development of such strategies; conducting of residential and commercial building energy audits; the provision of grants to nonprofit organizations and governmental agencies to perform energy efficiency retrofits; the development and implementation of programs to conserve energy used in Transportation; the development, implementation, and installation on or in any government building of on-site renewable energy technology; and more.

- RE: Consideration of appropriating funds for an additional Electrician position within the Utilities Department (\$80,261).

The Utilities Department needs an additional Electrician. This position was going to be requested through the budget process for FY24, however, due to increasing needs of the Department the position is being requested now. The current staff for electrical maintenance is not sufficient to provide timely preventative and corrective maintenance on the electrical equipment and infrastructure. This is due to the ageing infrastructure, the addition of equipment and new construction projects. The additional electrician will allow for better oversight of work, and will allow for more dedication to the Utilities Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system. The SCADA system enables the automated operation and monitoring of the plants well and lift stations. The expansion of the SCADA system and advancements in this technology require additional time and oversight.

The annual funding requirement for the position is projected at \$74,491; however, five (5) months of funding in the amount of \$30,261, plus a one-time expense of \$50,000 for a vehicle for the remainder of FY23 is requested for appropriation from the Utilities Operating Undesignated Fund Balance.

REQUESTING DEPARTMENT:

Utilities, Finance

FISCAL IMPACT:

Total estimated cost for the remainder of FY 23 is \$80,261 and a budget amendment will be submitted for appropriation on Budget Amendment #3. Pending approval of the budget amendment from Utilities Operating Undesignated Fund Balance (421-0000-392-3006), funds will be available in the Utilities Operating Funds (421-8014-536-1210 through 421-8014-536-6403) for the position.

RECOMMENDATION:

- RE: Consideration of appropriating funds for an additional Operations Division Manager position within the Utilities Department (\$39,419).

The Utilities Department needs an additional Operations Division Manager (DM). This position was going to be requested through the budget process for FY24, however, due to increasing needs of the Department the position is being requested now. Prior to 2018, there were two DM's, one for the Plants and one for Distribution, Collections & Maintenance. Under previous leadership one DM was eliminated and the divisions were combined. It has been determined that the workload requires two DM's to provide the necessary oversight of the sections within the divisions. In addition, the Department has a significant number of projects that require guidance from skilled DM's.

The annual funding requirement for the position is projected at \$97,607; however, five (5) months of funding in the amount of \$39,419 for the remainder of FY 23 is requested for appropriation from the Utilities Operating Undesignated Fund Balance.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Total estimated cost for the remainder of FY 23 is \$39,419 and a budget amendment will be submitted for appropriation on Budget Amendment #3. Pending approval of the budget amendment from Utilities Operating Undesignated Fund Balance (421-0000-392-3006), funds will be available in the Utilities Operating Funds (421-8014-536-1210 through 421-8014-536-2410) for the position.



The following request was not included in the September 21, 2022 approved travel and training spreadsheet for the Utilities Department; however, funding was approved in the Fiscal Year 2023 budget for this training opportunity. In FY 2023, the Utilities Department created a Compliance Inspector position. The Department is seeking to authorize training and travel specific to this position. The position is required to obtain a certificate in both Industrial Pretreatment and Fats, Oils, and Grease.

The Utilities Department is requesting Council's approval for the Compliance Inspector to attend the Florida Industrial Pretreatment Association (FIPA) Spring 2023 Training & Workshop from April 25-27 in Daytona Beach, Florida. The training offered at this workshop is catered towards individuals working in industrial pretreatment, laboratories, and/or utilities operations and provides them an opportunity to obtain an in-depth understanding of Fats, Oils & Grease (FOG) programs, Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSO), and the associated State Regulations. By attending the course, the employee will earn up to 1.6 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) and will have the opportunity to obtain a FOG Management – Level I Inspector certificate.

The workshop registration fee is \$280. The employee will utilize the City vehicle, departing on April 25 and returning on April 27. 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



RE: Acknowledgement of the City's monthly financial report for February 2023 (Unaudited).

Attached for your information is the monthly financial report which provides an overview of the City's financial activities for February 2023. February is the fifth month of the fiscal year and represents 42% of the annual budget year.

Citywide cash and investments increased by \$55.9 million or 19.12% in comparison to the prior year. This is primarily due to increased balances in Impact Fee funds, Utilities funds, General Fund and ARPA funds. This also contributed to the increase in Citywide revenues.

The General Fund is the City's primary operating fund. General Fund revenues received through February were \$57.6 million and are 54.1% of the annual budget. General Fund expenditures through the end of February were \$34.4 million and are 32.3% of the annual budget. General Fund total cash & investments on February 28, 2023, was \$59.9 million, which is \$12.1 million or 25.3% higher than one year ago.

General Fund revenues collected through February 28, 2023, overall were 20.6% higher than the revenues collected during the same period last year. The overall increase was mainly attributable to an increase in revenue collections from Ad Valorem Taxes and State shared revenues compared to the same period last year.

General Fund expenditures through February 28, 2023, overall were 11.5% higher than expenditures incurred during the same period last year. Pages 14 through 16 provide a summary of all funds' budget, revenues and expenditures posted for February 28, 2023.

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The City of Palm Bay, Florida's (the "City") monthly financial report presents an overview and analysis of the City's financial activities during the month of February 2023. February is the fifth month of the fiscal year and represents 42% of the annual budget.

Financial Report Summary

- Citywide revenues^{1*} of \$120.6 million are at 29.2% of the annual budget. Citywide expenditures^{1*} of \$77.6 million are at 18.8% of the annual budget. Traditionally revenue collections are two months in arrears. For this reason, certain revenues for grants and other governmental resources are accrued at year end to reflect the period in which it represents.
- Citywide cash and investments increased by \$55.9 million, or 19.1%, in comparison to the prior year. This was primarily due to increased balances in Impact Fee funds (\$17.0m), Utilities funds (\$11.9m), General Fund (12.1m) and the ARPA Fund (\$7.8m).
- Citywide revenues^{1*} increased by \$17.9 million, or 17.5% in comparison to the prior year.

- General Fund revenues of \$57.6 million are at 54.1% of the annual budget. This is an increase of \$9.8 million, or 20.6%, in comparison to the prior year.
- General Fund expenditures of \$34.4 million are at 32.3% of the annual budget. This is an increase of \$3.6 million, or 11.5%, in comparison to the prior year.
- General Fund cash and investments increased by \$12.1 million, or 25.3%, in comparison to the prior year. Of this increased General Fund cash, \$231,150 is reserved.








Impact Fees Cash & Investments




Fund Equity by Zone

Year-to-Date (YTD) Comparison: Water & Sewer



Year-to-Date (YTD) Cash & Fund Equity



> Year-to-Date (YTD) Cash & Fund Equity



> Year-to-Date (YTD) Cash & Fund Equity







Twenty seven years ago, I made Brevard County my home. I was drawn to the natural beauty and small-town feel. Brevard was then a great place to live, work, play and raise a family.

Over my 27 years here as a kayaker, cyclist and triathlete I have seen our waterways degrade. I used to swim in the Indian River Lagoon, but with the plastic pollution, algae blooms, and muck in our river now. I don't dare venture in the water anymore.

I've bicycled over tens of thousands miles of Brevard and Palm Bay and seen firsthand our aging infrastructure problem, which to the city's credit you all have made vast improvements.

I've worked with the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization to help create safer roads, multimodal pathways and walkable communities. I understand the backlog of road maintenance projects on all levels—city, county and state; and will continue to coordinate efforts to build a safer Palm Bay. A strong infrastructure — transportation, utilities — is essential to our cities economic development and prosperity. I want to look to our future and work toward energy independence with our tax dollars through green energy projects that will support our utilities and emergency services.

In the city of Palm Bay I have served on the Utility Advisory and Recreational Advisory Boards. I have also proudly served on the Charter Review Commission to bring fiscal responsibility, as unpopular as it was to a minority, to any future special election. Proven that I am not coerced by a small angry mob, but will do what is right for the city and citizens.

For Palm Bay to prosper, we need to support and grow our local businesses both large and small. When they prosper, there are more jobs, more opportunities for our residents to support themselves and their families. This can make all the difference for many of us who were hit hard by the economic downturn in 2006 and are still struggling through a recovery where wages have not kept up with housing costs. I know each of you already but as I apply to become a City Council Member, I would like to formally introduce myself. The way this seat became vacant is terrible for the former councilman, for the City Government, and for the citizens of the great city of Palm Bay. That has left you burdened with a great responsibility of replace that seat and I know this is not a responsibility you take lightly. It is also a great responsibility for whoever steps into that role. That person carries an extra weight of reestablishing the trust of the voters without having had the chance to campaign and let voters know who they are electing. With this is mind, I have prayerfully considered whether to proffer my application. I have consulted my family, my coworkers, my employer, and other community members who would be impacted by my decision. After much consideration I decided that I am being called to this position and that my personal experiences, professional background, and deeply held values make me the best candidate for this role at this time.

I grew up here in Brevard County and have seen Palm Bay and the rest of the County grow for the past 50 years. I graduated from Melbourne High School when Palm Bay High School, which is really in Melbourne, was the only High School in "Palm Bay." As you are aware, Councilman Foster has been absent from several meetings due to medical reasons.

Pursuant to Section 3.06(2) of the City Charter, "Absences created by illness, mental or physical disability, written suspension by court order, or other lawful written order or action shall not be considered absences for purposes of this subsection. However, the existence of an illness or mental or physical disability must be established by written medical evidence setting forth in detail the nature and cause of the illness or mental or physical disability and the prognosis thereof."

In addition, Section 50.57 of the Code of Ordinances states:

(A) When a temporary vacancy occurs in the office of councilmember as a result of an illness or mental or physical disability, such vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the following procedures:

(1) The councilmember is required to notify the city council of such illness or disability pursuant to section 3.063 of the city charter. The determination of such illness or disability shall be made by an affirmative vote of at least three (3) councilmembers.

(2) After the determination of such illness or disability by the city council, should the councilmember be absent from twelve (12) consecutive regular council meetings, the office shall be deemed vacated.
